Saturday, April 5, was not only an important day for all West Australian voters, it was the day of the very popular Yalgoo Race meeting.

The weather was sultry and thunderstorms made for dark and occasionally dusty conditions, especially as the much-anticipated Yalgoo Cup was run.

A crowd of about 500 people gathered at the Yalgoo racecourse from about midday onward.

Excellent entertainment tween races was provided by DJ Rev, and much laughter resulted from the botly contested games, running races and dancing competition.

Six races were held over the day. and spectators were able to have a flutter on each race with either of the local bookmakers on course.

The dress standard on the day was impeccable, and the best dressed lady and gentleman won prizes generously donated by Leon Baker Jewellers.

The bouncy castle proved a big hit with the many children who attended on the day, and kept them entertained as their parents flocked to the rails to watch the horses gallop home down the Yalgoo straight past the finish line.

As the 1850m MMG Golden Grove Yalgoo Cup was about to be run, a massive dust storm arose as the thunderstorms danced around the Yalgoo Township.

This dust made commentary on the cup difficult as it was virtually impossible to see the horses making their way around the track.

As they emerged into view along the home straight, the clear winner was Terry Brennan's horse Court Crusader, ridden by jockey Willie White.

As the thunderstorms drifted east and the dust settled, the final race was run and won, presentations were held, the traditional twoup game began on the track and dusk descended on Yalgoo.

The party went on well into the night with a delicious meal provided, excellent bar facilities and superb music for dancing. The Yalgoo race meeting epitomises bush racing at its best and is an occasion that many should try and attend in their lifetime.

Date Slice

Ingredients

375g dates - pitted and chopped 2/3 cup castor sugar 250g butter 1 egg Coconut

Pkt Marie Biscuits - 10-12 biscuits (or any plain biscuit will do) 1tsp Vanilla

Method:

- 1. Melt butter & sugar (allow to cool)
- 2. Chop dates while butter is cooling
- 3. Add chopped dates, vanilla & egg to melted butter and sugar
- 4. Reheat butter mixture & cook until dates soften & break up stirring gently
- 5. Break 10-12 biscuits into small pieces & add to date mixture
- 6. Grease / line slab tray (lamington tin) and sprinkle liberally with coconut
- 7. Pour date mixture into tin and smooth out
- 8. Sprinkle with coconut over top
- 9. Place in fridge when set cut into squares / fingers..... ENJOY !!

Chicken & Broccoli Pasta Bake

Ingredients

- 2 x 145 g Continental Alfredo with Garlic & Herbs Pasta Sauce
- 2 1/2 cups Reduced-fat Milk
- 2 cups Hot Water
- 1 tbsp Salt-reduced Margarine
- 1 Coles Hot Roast Chicken, skin and bones removed, meat shredded
- 1/2 cup Semi-dried Tomatoes, chopped
- 500 g Coles Brand Frozen Australian Broccoli Florets

1 Method

Leadership, Team building, Communication, Cultural Awareness, Environmental Awareness, Safety, Active participation and Respect

Suicide Prevention Fundraiser

On Saturday 24th May we completely filled the shire bus and took a mob down to the Geraldton Bowling Club for a fundraiser for a suicide prevention awareness program. Mick and Rose Webber intend on walking the entire Canning Stock Route to raise awareness around the issue of suicide and the night was to raise funds for their big adventure.

This is what Rose had to say about their planned trip.

"We are now getting ready for a gruelling

2000 km walk of the Canning Stock Route in July 2014. Mick and I will be walking the whole distance unassisted carrying all our own supplies, we also have a film crew in two vehicles, however they cannot assist us with our trek. We will be selling the DVD's upon our return of our trek with all money being donated from the sales to Suicide Prevention Australia.

Our aim is to create awareness about Suicide Prevention, by getting people talking about us doing the trek then talking about the reasons behind it and breaking down the barriers of Suicide Taboo - Stopping the Stigma.
