
Everyone was very complimentary of their day trip to Paynes Find and ready to sit back and have a little nap after an enjoyable day out.

ROAD TRIP





Preheat grill to high. Whisk together 2 eggs and 2 tbsp cream. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

Spinach, Cheese and Tomato Omelette

Melt 1 tsp of butter in a small non-stick frying pan on medium heat.

Pour in egg mixture and cook for 2-3 mins until base is set.

Scatter over quarter of the tomato and 1/4 cup of cheese.

Place under hot grill for 2 mins until puffed and golden.

Scatter over 1/4 cup baby spinach, fold omelette in half and serve.

Repeat with remaining ingredients to make 4 individual omelettes.

Ingredients

- 1.25L ginger beer
- 2 cups pineapple juice
- 1/2 cup vodka
- 1 cup soda water
- Ice cubes, to serve




Method

My Aged Care

My Aged Care: making it easier for elders and older people to access information on ageing and aged care

Recent changes to aged care (from 1 July) are giving people more choice and more of the services they might need as they get older.

To help create an aged care system that will cater to a growing number of older people in the future, there have been changes to the fee arrangements for aged care. The government will continue to meet the majority of costs for both home and residential care but, where people can afford to, they will be asked to contribute to the cost of their care.

To ensure aged care remains affordable for all older people there are limits on the maximum costs you may have to pay and you will never be denied the care that you need because you can't afford to pay.

The best way for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander older people and their families to find out about the choices available to them is to contact **My Aged Care** by calling **1800 200 422** (between 8.00am and 8.00pm local time on weekdays and between 10.00am and 2.00pm local time on Saturdays) where they can speak to a real person to get the information they need.

My Aged Care is a call centre and a website designed to make it easier for older people, their families and carers to access information on ageing and aged care.

My Aged Care can help you estimate the fees and charges you may have to pay towards your residential aged care or home care. A fee estimator is also available on the website for an idea of what you can expect to pay for your care. You can also find out about your choices, including home, community and residential aged care, and compare prices and services.




