

Goo Festa celebration of projects for our community

Yalgoo buzzed with activity on Friday 06 September 2013 when the Shire officially opened fourteen community infrastructure projects with a total value of \$5.26m.

The Shire has used \$650,000 of its own source funds as leverage to attract over \$4.5m in funding from state government, federal government and other organisations.

The undercover sport and recreation facility at the Yalgoo Community Hub was the flagship project. This area comprises a unique multi-function facility known as a rage cage which offers a variety of sporting options on the one court such as soccer, cricket, softball, basketball and hockey. The rage cage is complemented by a BMX track, skate park, mini-golf course, netball court and children's playground. Hopscotch and four square areas are marked out on the rubberised surface of the facility. A water playground completes this area, providing a range of healthy activities for all age groups.

Importantly, the facility is open for all to use and we encourage visitors to take advantage of the Yalgoo Community Hub sport and recreation facility. Stop in for a visit, or plan an activity with your school group. If you are bringing a group for structured activities please phone the Shire so we can avoid clashes.

Other projects that were opened included the very welcome Yalgoo Nursing Post which has provided a purpose built facility for medical services. The Shire is particularly proud of the attractive rammed earth executive residence at 48 Gibbons Street, which has lifted the profile of the main street. The first non-transportable home built in decades in Yalgoo, the house is constructed to last many years longer. Rammed earth also has establish the design and the cost. The Shire can then use the natural insulating properties to keep heating and cooling costs down.

Sealing of the Morawa Road has a high community impact and is nearly completed with only 17 kilometres remaining. When fully sealed the road provides direct sealed access to Perth and all weather access to the Super Town of Morawa. Through the efforts of the Shire to attract funding, sealing is expected to be completed five years earlier than planned. Finally, the Yalgoo Cemetery project has shown great respect through tidying up the overgrown area and adding signs, a grave site map, rammed earth niche wall and some all important shade. Extensive research was required to establish the list of graves.

The project opening was followed by two days of community celebration culminating in a revival of the Yalgoo Emu Cup. Although the concert on Friday was rained out we all enjoyed the spectacular fireworks that lit up the sky, interspersed by a lightning show.

The opening of these projects is a milestone, but the Shire is still working to improve community infrastructure.

Projects under way this year include a major upgrade to the caravan park, enhancements to the flag area at Community Park which will include the Aboriginal flag and a war memorial, further sealing of the Morawa Road, and a caravan day parking area at Paynes Find.

The Shire is also designing and costing the Youth and Community Centre and the Volunteer Emergency Services Training and Operations Centre (VESTOC) that will include redeveloping the Shire depot. These are both expensive projects, and the business case must be prepared first to business case to apply for funding.

Making up the total of fourteen were a range of smaller projects included refurbishments at the Yalgoo Community Hall, ADSL and exchange upgrade, first stage upgrades at the caravan park including residence, six new drive-through bays and a dump point, crib room at the Shire depot and a range of solar lighting projects including the Yalgoo airstrip. A water-wise reticulation project has greatly improved our ability to keep the town green whilst reducing water use.

These projects have been made possible by the enthusiasm and hard work of Shire staff, and the support of a forward thinking Council.

The Shire will keep consulting with you, the community, on projects including the town site revitalisation. Watch out for invitations in the Bulldust so that you get to participate in making decisions for your town and Shire.





GOMMUNITY NOTICE

Dog & Cat Registrations Due NOW! - 1 November 2013

All dogs over three (3) months of age must be registered. Dogs should be registered with the Council where they normally reside. Should you move within the State, you do not have to re-register your dog, but the change of address must be given to the Council where the dog is currently registered. All registrations are due on the first of November each year and run either one year or three years.

Registration helps you to recover your dog if lost and assists the Council to encourage responsible dog ownership and provide services to dog owners for the benefit of the entire community.

A person under 18 years of age may not lawfully register a dog in his / her name. The dog must be

registered by a parent or another adult who will then be regarded as the lawful owner.

Upon production of a Pensioner Concession Card or both a Commonwealth and State Seniors card pensioners may register their dogs for half the prescribed fee.





The official opening of the rage cage and under-cover sports facility

Yalgoo Town-site Revitalisation Project

Community consultations are coming up for an important shire project. The Shire has engaged Urbis Planning from Perth to develop a town-site Revitalisation Strategy.

Urbis will be here in the second week of December to meet with as many members of the community as possible to get your views on a whole range of things that are important to Yalgoo now, and into the future.

The will be talking to you about beautification of Gibbons street and the highway and what facilities should be available, how all the parks should be used and what amenities and information are available in them and also things like a touristtrail inside and outside of town.

Aboriginal Family Law Services

We had Dianne and Carol from the Geraldton based Aboriginal Family Law Services recently. They were here to promote their servic e and to see if there was anyone in Yalgoo who might need their support.

The service can assist Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who are survivors of family violence or sexual assault; or non-indigenous people who are survivors of family violence or sexual assault IF it will benefit an indigenous person.

The service provides information, legal advice, negotiation with the other party, representation at Court, finsing someone else who can help and they can do it face to face or over the phone.

The service deals with family law matters relating to chilsdren's arrangements, violence restraining orders, matters concerning welfare of children and criminal injuries compensation.

The service is at 66 Fitzgerald Street, Geraldton or they can be phoned on 9965 4654.

And of course the service is FULLY CONFIDENTIAL

While she was here, Diane from Aboriginal Family Law services left a paper on Dadirri which is a special quality, a unique gift of Aboriginal people. Here is Dadirri explained.

'Dadirri' Deep listening explained

Aboriginal people passed on stories orally as they knew no writing. Listening to the story teller was vital to reproduce the story accurately to the next generation of story-tellers.

Deep listening describes the processes of deep and respectful listening to build community—a way of encouraging people to explore and learn from the ancient heritage of Aboriginal culture, knowledge and understanding [2].

Deep listening is also called dadirri in southern Queensland.

[Dadirri] is in everyone. It is not just an Aboriginal thing.—Miriam-Rose Ungunmerr-Baumann, Aboriginal writer [5]

Aboriginal writer Miriam-Rose Ungunmerr-Baumann describes deep listening as follows [1].

"Dadirri is inner, deep listening and quiet, still awareness. Dadirri recognises the deep spring that is inside us. We call on it and it calls to us. This is the gift that Australia is thirsting for. It is something like what you call 'contemplation'.

When I experience dadirri, I am made whole again. I can sit on the riverbank or walk through the trees; even if someone close to me has passed away, I can find my peace in this silent awareness. There is no need of words. A big part of dadirri is listening."

"In our Aboriginal way, we learnt to listen from our earliest days. We could not live good and useful lives unless we listened. This was the normal way for us to learn - not by asking questions. We learnt by watching and listening, waiting and then acting."

"My people are not threatened by silence. They are completely at home in it. They have lived for thousands of years with Nature's quietness. My people today, recognise and experience in this quietness, the great Life-Giving Spirit, the Father of us all."


Another part of dadirri is "the quiet stillness and the waiting," says Ungunmerr-Baumann.

"Our Aboriginal culture has taught us to be still and to wait. We do not try to hurry things up. We let them follow their natural course - like the seasons."

Dadirri is also used as a prayer, a prayer in the sense of you just feel the presence of the Great Creator.—Miriam-Rose Ungunmerr-Baumann, Aboriginal writer [5]

Dr Laura Brearley, author of the Deep Listening Book, says "deep listening is about tuning in... Deep listening is based on stories, silences and the spaces that lie between. As a research methodology, the practice of deep listening is an invitation into culturally congruent ways of learning and knowing." [2]

It does wonders for a person to just be still and listen to someone else talk about their life and how they probably came through things. You never know what you'll learn.—Archie Roach, Aboriginal singer and songwriter [4]


1 teaspoon ginger, peeled and grated 1/2 head broccoli, cut into florets 100g snow peas, ends and strings removed 2 tablespoons water 1 tablespoon oyster sauce

1/2 tablespoon reduced-salt soy sauce

Return beef to pan. In a small bowl combine water, cornflour and sauces. Stir through beef and vegetables and allow to bubble and thicken. Serve with noodles. Serves 4.

Variation

Substitute 400g lean pork leg steak for beef. Replace broccoli and snow peas with other vegetables, eg: Chinese cabbage, bok choy and sliced carrots.



1 teaspoon cornflour

1 teaspoon chilli sauce

Choose tight compact heads with blue/green colour. In an airtight bag in refrigerator crisper. Stir-fries, salads, vegetable side dishes, frittatas and all short-time

cooking dishes.

Boil or steam for 4-7 minutes, depending on size of floret or microwave in a covered dish with 2 tablespoons water on HIGH (100%) for 4-5 minutes until tender, stirring after 2 minutes to ensure even cooking.
