



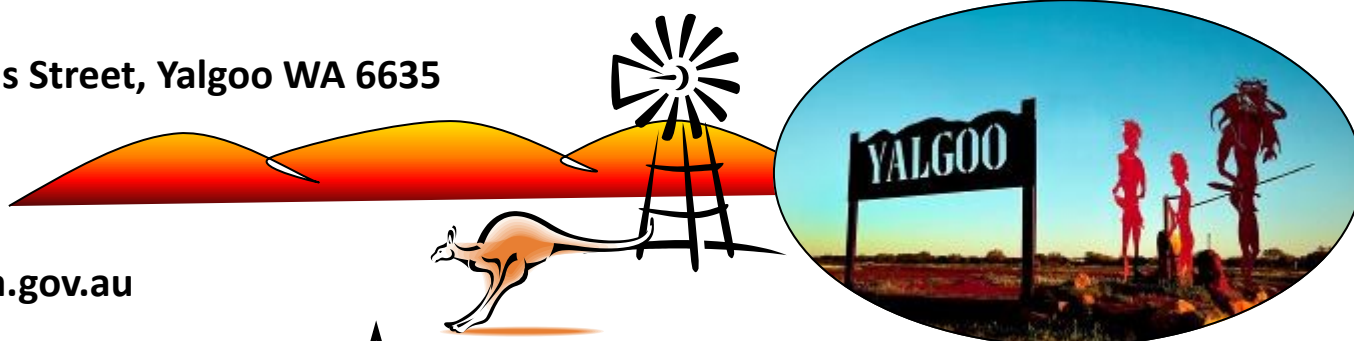

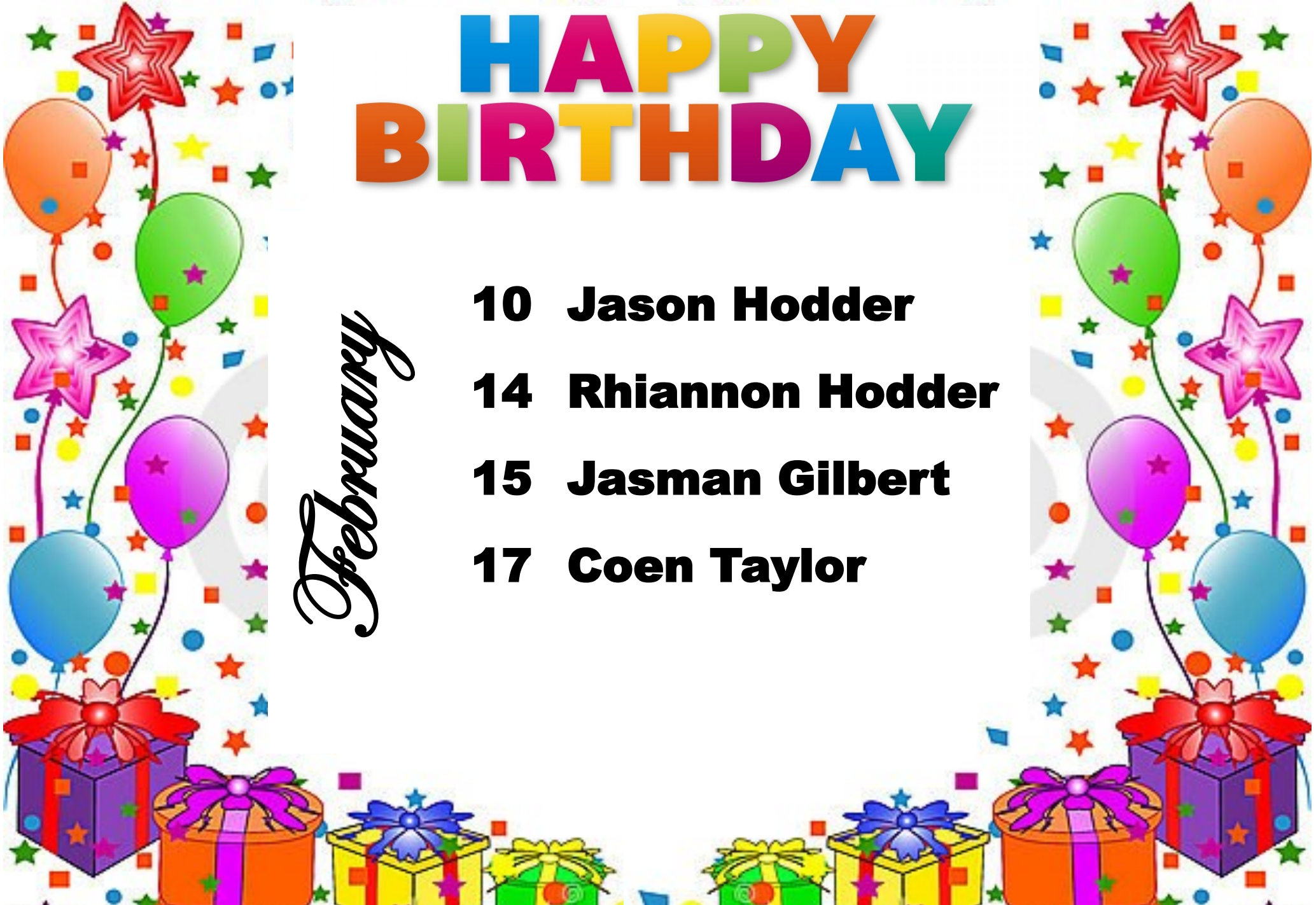

- 3-4 large basil leaves

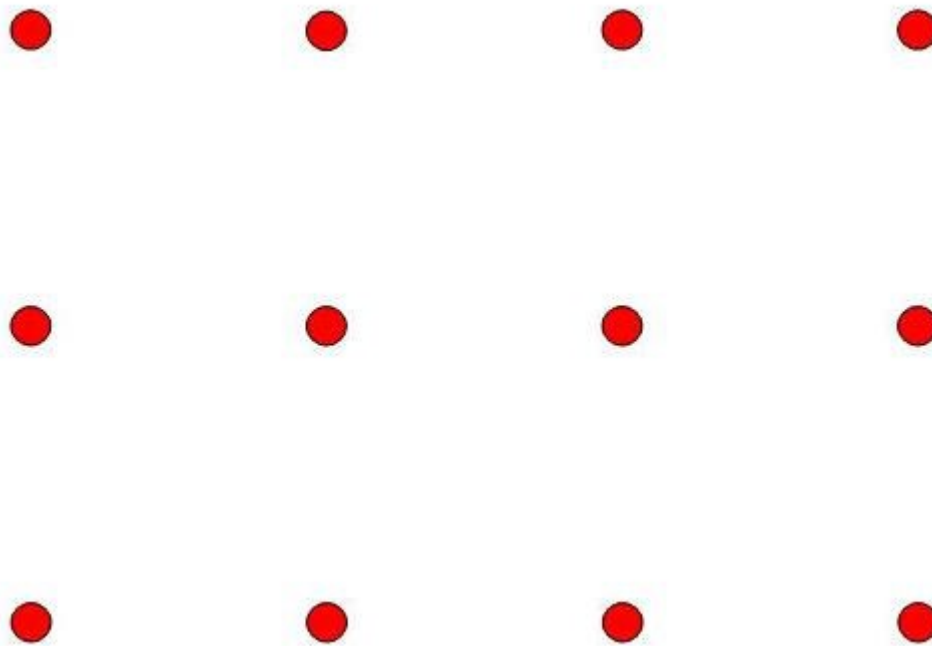

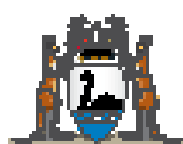

Hello Fellow Community Members,

On Tuesday 10th of February 2015, Yalgoo Shire Councillors President N Grinham, Deputy President R Valenzuela, Cr P Lawson and Cr Adam Fawkes made the road trip to Carnarvon for the opening of Vince Catania's new office. We were able to set up a meeting with Minister Terry Redman, Minister Mia Davies, Vince Catania MLA, Jacqui Boydell MLC and Staff prior to the opening of the new office.

The topics discussed were:

(1) The Vermin Cell fence.

Minister Redman explained in quite some detail what the situation was with the project.

My main question was that because the Shire of Yalgoo had committed a substantial amount of regional funds already to the project, can you tell us if the project going to be completed?

Minister Redman said that it was in the hands of the Regional Development Commission and he would keep us updated on the progress.

(2) The new town water supply treatment plant will be up and running in 2016-2017.

(3) The town oval: Vince and Mia Davies are following through with this for us and will speak to the Education department about developing the oval opposite the Primary School.

(4) The release of Crown town housing blocks: Minister Redman will be working with us on trying to simplify the process.

(5) The Paynes Find Mobile Tower: we were told it will be up and running in 2016, If it is not done in the end of the first funding round it will be highest priority in the second round of funding.

(6) There was mention of a new approach to be taken by Government in dealing with Aboriginal issues and processes.

Minister Redman indicated he would like to get involved in the rolling out of this. He commented that many things in the past have been of no benefit to the Aboriginal People and would like to look at fresh ideas.

We were treated with great hospitality and many kind words about Yalgoo were said in the speeches by Minister Redman and Vince Catania.

They were much appreciated and the Ministers are keen to strongly support us with the future development of Yalgoo.

Also Over the next short period, Ross Theedom (CEO) will be unavailable. During his absence please feel free to make your enquiries to the Acting CEO, Silvio Brenzi. You will be able to contact him in the usual office here in Gibbons St."

"I was very pleased to see councillors from across electorate travel to Camarvon for the opening. Particularly due to the distances involved. It was great to see Councillors from as far as Yalgoo, Shark Bay, Exmouth and Upper Gascoyne join local Camarvon councillors to discuss issues and challenges we have in common."

I am pretty sure that there will be a Gascoyne contingent at the Yalgoo cup on the 11th of April with the Yalgoo councillors talking up their great event." Said Vince, adding "It brings home to me how much the communities in my electorate have in common, despite the distances and differing geography of the region."
