



I have now been in town for a couple of weeks, having arrived from Halls Creek with my wife Jacqui and welcome parade has been totally awesome, if I'd known I was going to receive such a warm welcome I would have come here years ago. A huge Thank you.

I have been a police officer for over 30 years and the last 10 years as a Sergeant, I have served in Kintore (NT), South Hedland and the last 4 years in Halls Creek, I have learnt a vast amount about indigenous culture and I'm looking forward to learning more from you.

In the next couple of weeks, we will be getting our third officer here, Senior Constable Brigham DENNISON, ex Mullewa officer, who has spent the last 6 years working with me and will be an asset to the community of Yalgoo.

Our resident officer Blair has shown me around the town and he is also definitely an asset to this community. Now to the policing news.

If you are going to go away for holidays etc. then please let us know at the police station, I will ensure that regular patrols are conducted around your premises and keep in contact with you if unfortunately something should happen whilst you're away.

I've also noticed that there are a lot of children riding around on push bikes and scooters and none of these kids are wearing helmets, I urge you parents to be vigilante in ensuring your kids are wearing helmets etc. when riding their bikes, protect your assets and protect your future.

We also need to know who's who in our community, with a population of around 150 people it's not hard to tell if someone new arrives, if you see people acting suspiciously around town then please report it immediately, no matter how small you think it maybe, it might just be the one link in the puzzle that police are looking for.

Also make sure that your houses and sheds etc. are locked up at all times, burglars always look for the easiest opportunities and if you leave your doors or windows unlocked then you are going to be next.

If you attend the police station and we're not there, it's because we're out patrolling your community, or out on the Highways, but we are only a phone call away, so if you get diverted to Geraldton, please don't hang up, just leave a message and we will get in touch with you as soon as possible.

With Yalgoo Race Day on the 11th April 2015, we will see a large influx of people from around the state arriving in town. I have employed police from our neighbouring police stations to be in Yalgoo overnight and hopefully it will be a good day for everyone.

There will be a no tolerance approach to anti-social behaviour



AIRBORNE MAGNETIC & RADIOMETRIC SURVEY

Between May and October 2015.




A low-level airborne geophysical survey is being conducted in an area between Yalgoo, Perenjori and Paynes Find

During survey operations, the aircraft will fly at a height of 50m above the ground along E-W lines 100 m apart and N-S lines 1000 m apart. In the southwest of the area, the line spacing will be 200 m

The objective of the survey is to support the regional geological mapping of Western Australia.

So please don't be alarmed if you see an aircrafts flying low to the ground.





















Traditional Anzac Biscuits



- 1 cup (150g) plain flour
- 1 cup (80g) desiccated coconut
- 1 cup (90g) rolled oats
- 1/2 cup (110g) caster sugar
- 1/4 cup (55g) brown sugar
- 125 g butter
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 1/2 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper. Place the flour, coconut, rolled oats and combined sugar in a large bowl and stir with a wooden spoon to combine.
- 2. Place the butter and golden syrup in a small saucepan over low heat and cook, stirring occasionally, for 3 minutes or until butter is melted. Set aside for 5 minutes to cool slightly.
- 3. Combine 1 1/2 tablespoon boiling water and the bicarbonate of soda in a small bowl. Add to the oat mixture along with the butter mixture. Stir until well combined.
- 4. Roll tablespoonful's of the mixture into balls and place on the lined trays, allowing space for spreading. Gently press each ball to flatten slightly. Bake for 15 minutes for crisp biscuits. Set aside on the trays to cool completely. The biscuits will harden as they cool.

Lemon-lime Fizz

INGREDIENTS

- 160 ml lime juice cordial
- 1 1/4 litre lemonade
- 500 ml lemon sorbet
- lemon or lime slices to serve




Method

1. Place 1 tbsp lime cordial into each glass (1 cup capacity). Divide the lemonade between the glasses then add a scoop of sorbet. Add lemon and/or lime slices and serve immediately

WHAT IS THE ABORIGINAL JUSTICE PROGRAM?

Background:

The Department of the Attorney General (DotAG) is working towards reducing the over representation of Aboriginal people in the justice system through the Aboriginal Justice Program (AJP) within the Policy and Aboriginal Services Directorate.

The AJP has two focus areas relating to Aboriginal people either in or at risk of entering the justice system.

How does the AJP work?

The two focus areas of the AJP are:

- Motor Drivers Licensing issues; and
- Fines Enforcement;

The AJP operates in identified priority locations for the delivery of services related to the two focus areas and uses a number of mechanisms to undertake related projects. For example: Open Days have been run at various towns and communities as a mechanism to achieve outcomes in the Motor Drivers Licensing and Fines Enforcement areas.

Why is the AJP important?

Aboriginal people represent only 3% of the State's population but make up approximately 40% of prisoners and 70% of juvenile detainees. Aboriginal people are five times more likely to be the victim of a violent crime.

What is the AJP doing?

Open Days

Open Days support community development through targeting services and providing access to resources for Aboriginal people. The coordinated approach is committed to empowering Aboriginal people and building their capacity while increasing education and awareness. An aim is to reduce the risk of Aboriginal people entering the justice system.

Open Days include representatives from Department of Transport; Centrelink; Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages; Fines Enforcement Registry; Aboriginal Justice Program; and other services based on location and need.

FIVE WAYS YOU CAN SAVE YOUR BABY'S LIFE

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR BABY IS CHOKING

- 1. Check their mouth
- 2. Slap it out
- Lay your baby face down on your thigh and support their head
- > Up to five blows between their shoulder blades.



3. Squeeze it out

- > Using two fingers, give up to five chest thrusts
- > Check the mouth. If the obstruction hasn't cleared call for an ambulance.



WHAT TO DO IF YOUR BABY IS UNCONSCIOUS

- 1. Check for a response
- > Tap their foot and call their name.



- 2. Open their airway
 - Gently tilt the head back.



3. Check for breathing



- 4. If they are breathing
- > Hold them in the recovery position (see below).

If they are not breathing

Begin CPR.

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR BABY HAS STOPPED BREATHING

If your baby is unconscious and they are not breathing, follow these steps to perform CPR.

- 1. Call for an 2. Breathe
 - ambulance > Put your lips around their mouth and nose and blow steadily for up to one second
 - Give five initial rescue breaths.



3. Pump

 Using two fingers in the centre of the chest, give 30 chest compressions at a rate of 100-120 per minute.



4. Repeat

- Give two rescue breaths followed by 30 chest compressions
- Continue CPR until help arrives.

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR BABY HAS A SEIZURE (FIT)

Make it safe

- 1. Clear objects that may cause injury
- 2. Don't try to restrain them
- > Put pillows or soft padding around them.

3. Cool them

> Take away bedding and remove a layer of clothing.

4. Call for an ambulance

> When seizure has stopped, put them in the recovery position while you wait.



HOW TO HOLD A BABY IN THE RECOVERY POSITION

1. Cradle them in your arms, with their head tilted downwards



- 2. Call for an ambulance
- 3. Monitor their breathing, pulse and level of response




