# From the CEO's desk

March 2014



## A Fond Farewell to Yalgoo

After four years as CEO of the Shire of Yalgoo it is time for me to move on and hand over the reins.

The past four years have been endlessly challenging and equally rewarding.

Major floods in December 2010 and February 2011 caused extensive damage across our 1,000 km road network. Freak storms in February 2011 also de-roofed the tavern and community centre at Paynes Find.

The rain resulted in a magnificent wildflower season; and the worst bushfires that the district has ever seen. From 1 December 2011 to 28 February 2012 an area of over 250,000 hectares was burnt and 100 extra professionals and volunteers descended on Yalgoo to respond to the multi complex emergency.

Despite the above, and complicated by staff shortages, the Shire still managed to:

- Build the new water park and nursing post
- Consult, design, win funding and build the 'rage cage' covered multiple sporting complex
- Build the first non transportable housing in Yalgoo in decades
- Win funding to upgrade the Yalgoo Caravan Park
- Restore a Shire of Yalgoo community development program
- Prepare the first Community Strategic Plan with integrated business plans
- Revive the Yalgoo Emu Cup
- Restore and improve the Yalgoo cemetery
- Yalgoo Morawa Road will be sealed this year, being six years ahead of plan.

For most of my term I had the pleasure of working with President Terry Iturbide. Terry was a compassionate leader who had the interests of all sectors of the community at heart.

When Terry resigned from Council in December 2013 councillors elected Neil Grinham as their new President. Neil has taken the lead from Terry with confidence and will keep the council's program going in full flight with the incoming CEO.

I welcome Bruce Walker, who will commence as acting CEO on 17 March 2014. Bruce and his wife Susan arrived in Yalgoo this week for Bruce to have a handover period. Bruce tells me that he is not accustomed to the luxury of a handover in his

travels around the region acting in locations that include Wiluna and Sandstone. Bruce will be familiar to many, as he was formerly CEO of Morawa Shire and also Carnarvon Shire.

Bruce brings a wealth of experience in the role of CEO in our region. He promises to do more than care-take during the period while Council recruits for a permanent CEO.

Projects to complete include the caravan park upgrade, which is on track to be ready in time for the races in April. The military history memorial in Community Park, along with new flagpoles to fly the state and aboriginal flags, is also scheduled for completion in time for the centenary of ANZAC.

Long outstanding projects at Paynes Find are high on the priority list including entrance statements and the Paynes Find waste facility.

Architectural plans are being drawn up for the Youth and Community Centre, after which funding will need to be sourced.

The Shire is also preparing a business case to apply for funding to rebuild the Shire works depot and incorporate a volunteer emergency services training and operations centre (VESTOC). A large shed will protect our machinery that is currently exposed to the elements. A mezzanine floor inside the shed will provide office space, training rooms and an incident control centre that will be available to the region.

The Shire will continue to have a busy period of growth, reflecting the aspirations of the community.

Importantly, thank you to all of my staff for your work. Whether you have been with the Shire for many years or have just started, whether you clean, garden, operate machinery, work with the community or in the office, together you make it possible for the Shire to serve its community.

Councillors, you volunteer your time for your community and the decisions that you make are taking Yalgoo into a bright and progressive future.

Yalgoo has worked its magic on me, and I will always consider myself a 'Yalگووite' – which is what the council asked for when they employed me. Yalgoo is in my heart. I will watch progress from a distance, and I will very much look forward to visiting sometime in the future.

I wish every individual and the community as a whole much future joy and continual progress.

**Enrolling to Vote**  
A local government extraordinary in-person election is to be held in the Shire of Yalgoo on Saturday 3 May 2014. You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote at the election if you reside in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the district.

**Residents**  
You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State electoral roll as at 5.00 pm, Friday 14 March 2014. If you are not already on the State electoral roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

**Enrolment Forms – Residents**  
Electoral enrolment forms are available from the Shire of Yalgoo; all post offices, all Australian Electoral Commission Offices or the Western Australian Electoral Commission. They must be completed and returned to any Divisional Returning Officer of the Australian Electoral Commission in Western Australia by 5.00 pm, Friday 14 March 2014.

**Non Resident Owners and Occupiers**  
If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Yalgoo and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote but must submit an Enrolment Eligibility Claim form to the local government, as enrolment is not automatic.  
A non-resident owner who was on the last Shire of Yalgoo local government roll continues to retain that status as long as the rateable property to which the enrolment relates is owned. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Yalgoo to confirm their enrolment status.  
If you are not on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Yalgoo, you may still be eligible to enrol to vote. Please contact the Shire of Yalgoo for details.  
A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth electoral roll in respect of a residence outside the electorate.

**Enrolment Forms – Non Resident Owners and Occupiers**  
Enrolment Eligibility Claim forms can be obtained from the Shire of Yalgoo and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5.00 pm, Friday 14 March 2014.

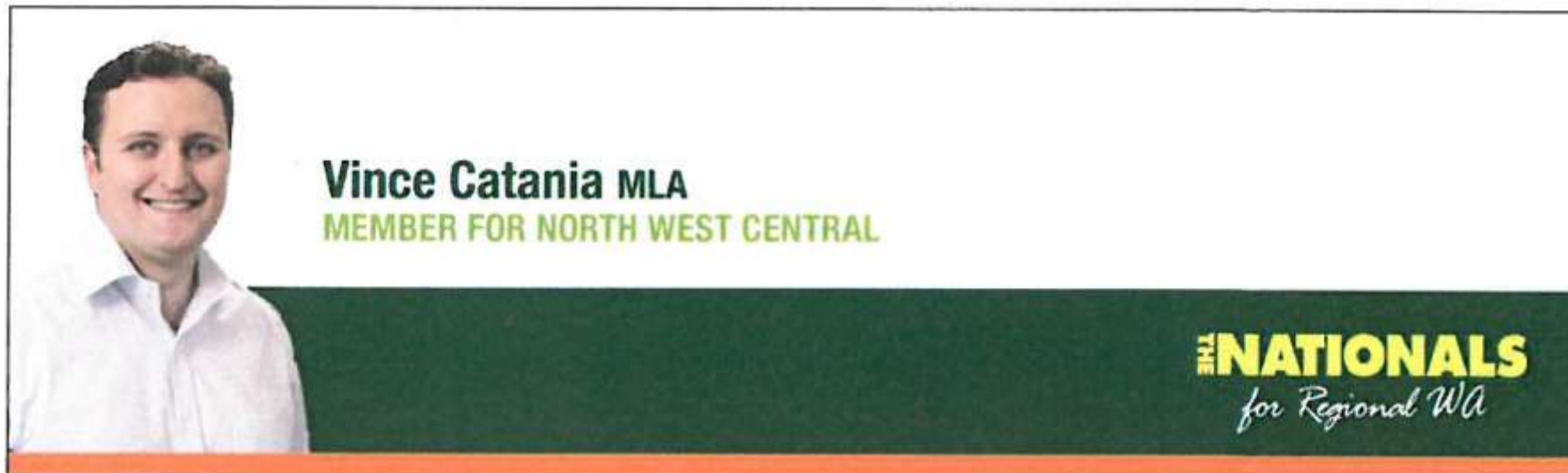
The road works formation on the Yalgoo Morawa road is nearly completed. We are on the last 13 kilometres and all going well should finish it over the next couple of weeks.

### **WA's oldest concrete bridge to be replaced**

The replacement of the Ballinyoo Bridge will vastly improve the key Carnarvon-Mullewa Road access route thanks to \$3.5 million of Royalties for Regions funding announced last week.

The project, being delivered as part of the Mid West Investment Plan (MWIP), involves building a new bridge to span the Murchison River, replacing the existing 1929-built structure that has aged beyond repair.

Member for North West Central Vince Catania MLA said the bridge provided a lifeline for communities, industry, service providers and emergency services in the remote Murchison and Upper Gascoyne district.

"During times of flood lower level crossings of the Murchison River become impassable and without this bridge parts of the district can become isolated for extended periods," he said.

"A new bridge and upgraded road will increase the scope of tourism opportunities, provide an alternative route within the Gascoyne-Murchison Outback Pathways and ensure communities in the region stay connected."

Sections of the old bridge may be preserved and developed by the Shire of Murchison into interpretive material at the site, enriching the tourist experience.

Mr Catania said the Carnarvon-Mullewa Road was the main access route to the Murchison Radio-Astronomy Observatory, a project that has also received \$10 million in Royalties for Regions funding through the MWIP.

"As this project unfolds more sealing of the Carnarvon-Mullewa Road will be triggered, progressively improving road quality for all users," Mr Catania said.

Other road improvement projects in North West Central to receive MWIP funding include the Wubin-Mullewa Road (\$10.8m) and the Meekatharra-Wiluna Road (\$10m).

The \$220 million Royalties for Regions-funded MWIP aims to assist establishing a more sustainable social and economic base by implementing major infrastructure projects and initiatives that have been identified as essential to the Mid West region.

Royalties for Regions has committed \$72.778 million to 24 approved MWIP projects to date that have a total project value of \$152.447 million.

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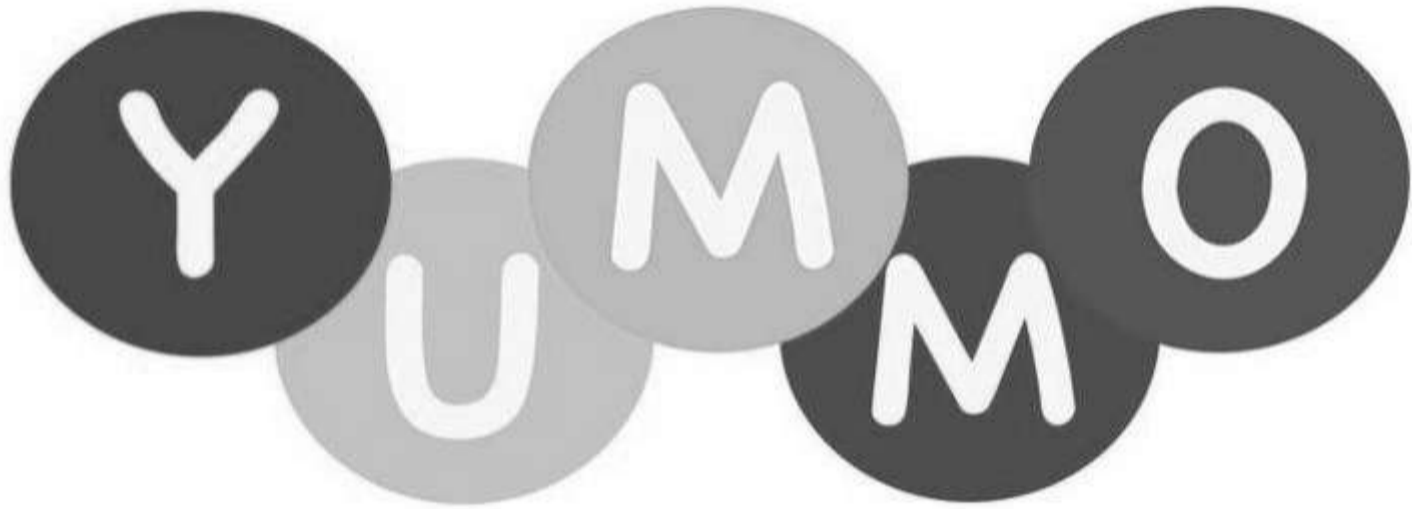
## Pumpkin Bread

*Ingredients*

2 cups sugar	1 cup vegetable oil
4 eggs, lightly beaten	1 (16 ounce) can solid-pack pumpkin
3 1/2 cups AP flour	2t baking soda
1t baking powder	1t salt
1t cinnamon, ground	1t nutmeg, ground
1/2t clove, ground	1/2t allspice, ground
1/2c water	(can sub 3/4c applesauce + 1/4c oil for 1c oil)

*Directions*

In a large bowl, combine sugar, oil and eggs. Add pumpkin and mix well. Combine dry ingredients; add to the pumpkin mixture alternately with water. Pour into two greased 9-in. x 5-in. x 3-in. loaf pans. Bake at 350 F for 60-70 minutes or until bread tests done. Cool in pans 10 minutes before removing to a wire rack; cool completely.

## Caramel Corn

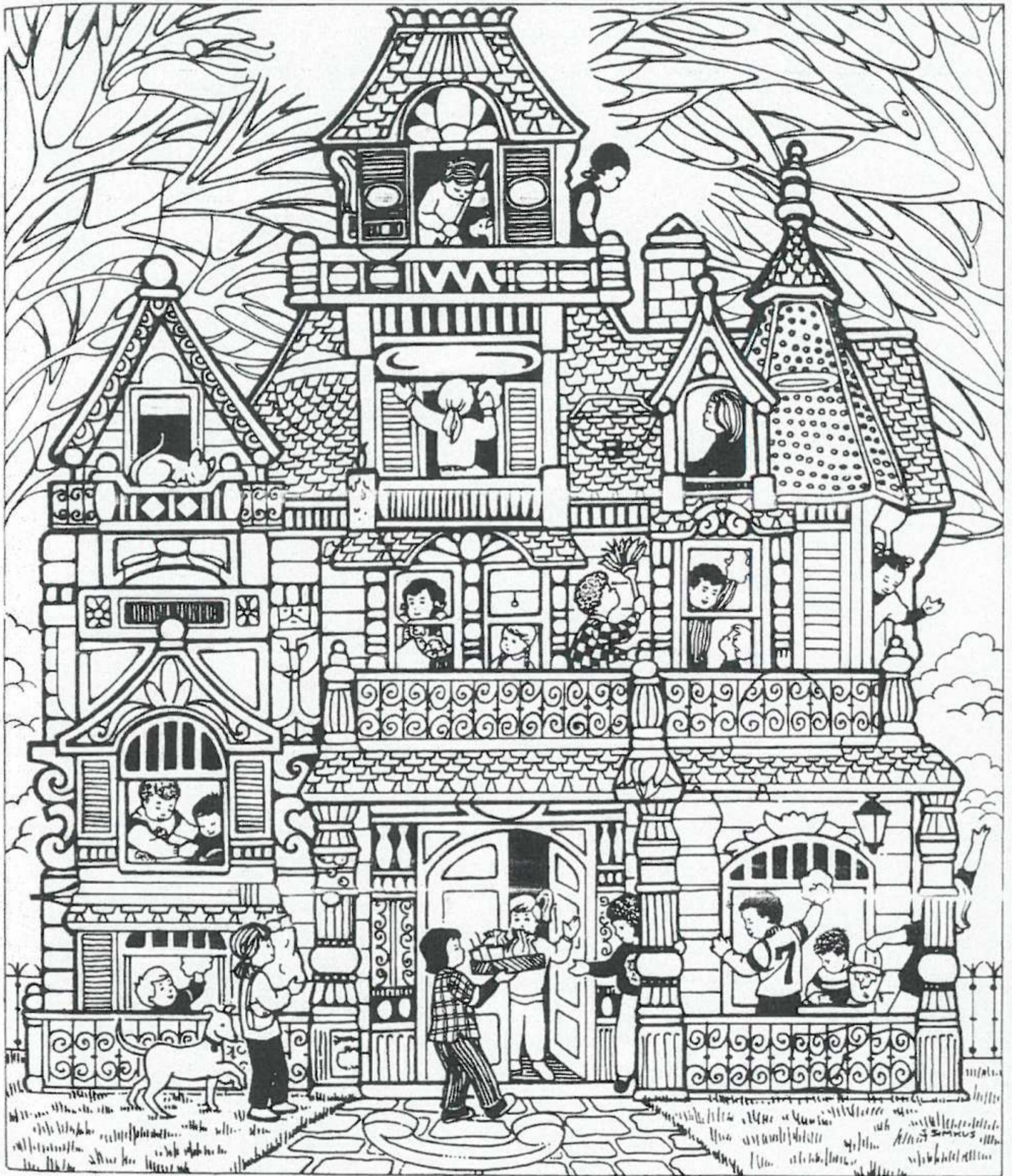
*Ingredients*

- 8 cups popped popcorn
- 4 cups oven-toasted rice cereal squares
- 2 cups miniature pretzel twists
- 1 cup pecan halves
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 1/4 cup light corn syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda

*Directions*

Preheat oven to 300 F. Combine popcorn, cereal, pretzels and pecans in large bowl. Combine brown sugar, butter and corn syrup in 2 Quart Sauce pan. Cook and stir with wooden spoon over medium heat until mixture comes to a boil over entire surface. Reduce heat to medium-low. Cook without stirring 5 minutes. (Mixture should continue to bubble gently over surface). Remove saucepan from heat. Quickly stir in vanilla and baking soda, stirring carefully. Pour over popcorn mixture in bowl, stirring until well coated. Spread onto cookie sheet or roasting pan. Bake 30 minutes, stirring after 15 minutes. Transfer popcorn mixture to large piece of parchment paper. Cool completely, breaking mixture into clusters as it cools.

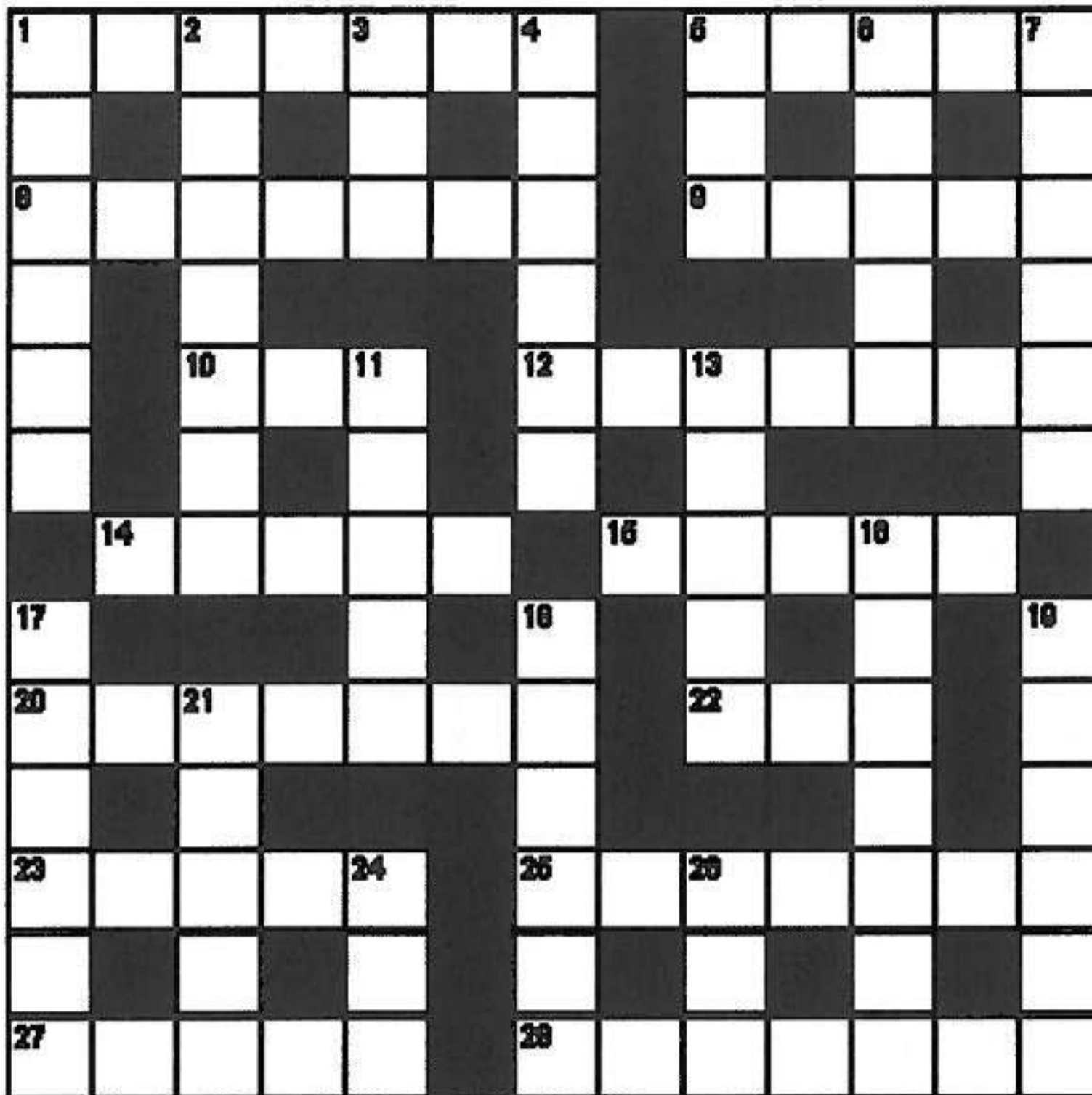

Some points to note about the holiday programs:

The Yalgoo school holiday program is for kids in school so....

- If you are over 18 and not a parent and you want to be involved...you are most welcome...but, you are coming as an adult so there are 2 things you need to understand. 1. Under law you must have a Working with Children Card and 2. You must be there to help run the activity.
- For camps away, even parents of kids need to have a Working with Children Card. So if you want to come away on future camps then come and see me and we can get your Working with Children Card sorted out.
- Any kids who break the law or misbehaves may not be allowed to come away on the next camp or activity.

# Disability Access & Inclusion Plan

The Shire of Yalgoo is committed to making our area great place for all its residents and visitors. One of the ways we do this is by making sure we have a really decent Disability Access and Inclusion Plan. The plan works towards ensuring that,

- individuals with disabilities and their families/carers enjoy living in an accessible friendly place;
- the local community is supported in developing and delivering facilities, information and programs that are inclusive of everyone in the community;
- awareness of issues for people with disabilities and their families/carers is raised through events and training; and
- people with disabilities are able to be involved in decision making about their community.

## But what does this all mean, this access and inclusion stuff?

Often, people think that access relates only to buildings. While physical access is very important, it is only part of the picture, and the current legislation requires that Local Governments consider access more broadly in their disability access and inclusion plans so that people with disabilities are considered and included in all areas of the council's operations. This means that people with a disability must have equitable access to:



- Services (eg accessible footpaths, kerb ramps, help with rubbish bins etc)
- Buildings and facilities (auto doors, access toilets, ramps, accessible play areas etc)
- Information (information in other formats such as Browse aloud on City's website, easy to read brochures etc)
- Staff with awareness and skills to assist people with disabilities (staff training in disability awareness, communication etc)
- Complaints process (making sure people know about these and are supported to access them as required)
- Community Consultation (ensuring people with disabilities are able to take part in all consultation not just those regarding disability issues; consulting with local people with a disability on access issues)
- Employment (eg work experience, volunteering, recruitment practices)

The Shire aims to achieve improved access and inclusion through the strategies outlined in our Disability Access and Inclusion Plan. The Plan is now up for review and will be re-written over the next couple of months. I will be doing consultations with the community over that period so I ask you to let anyone know who might have a disability. I would really like to hear from the community about what we can do to make it easier for them to get about from place to place, get a job, make a complaint or get information from the Shire. Please contact me on 99628174. Otherwise expect a survey soon and then I hope to get some great responses back from you.

# War Memorial / ANZAC DAY

The Shire is building its first commemorative wall to service men and women from the Boer War through until the Vietnam War.

My name is Silvio Brenzi I was born in Northampton and grew up in Geraldton attending Beachlands Primary School.

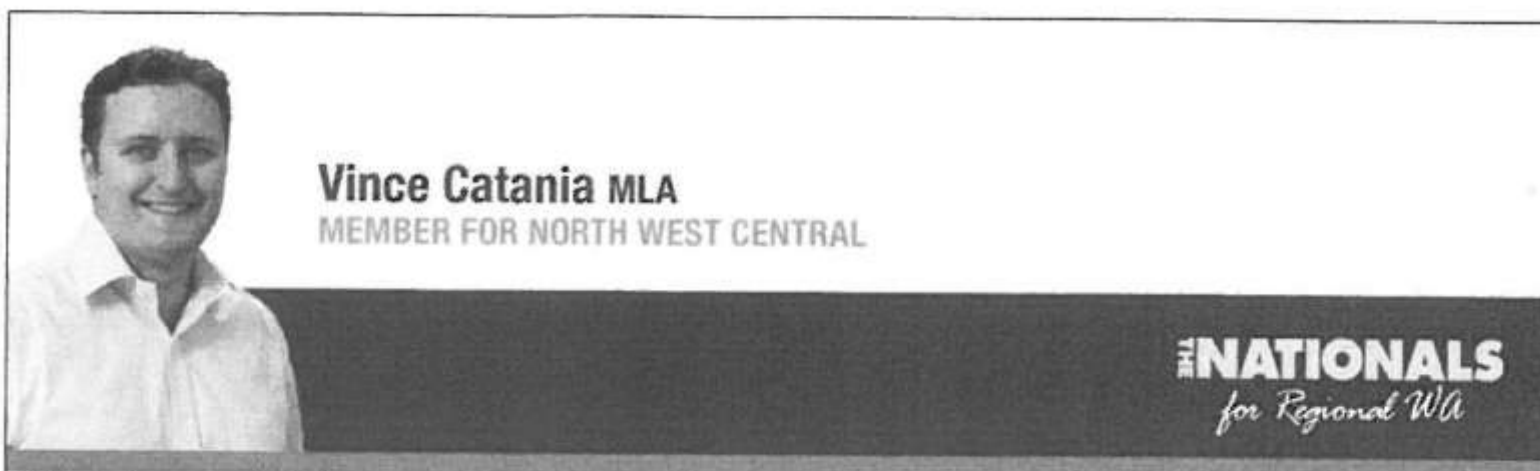
Our family moved to Baldivis in 1985 where I attended Kwinana High School to Year 10, leaving in 1988.

### **Parliamentary Inquiry into PATS Initiated**

Vince Catania MLA, has welcomed news the Standing Committee on Public Administration initiated a parliamentary inquiry into the State Government's Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATS) today.

The inquiry responded to The Nationals' call for a review of the system in November last year, when Agricultural Region member Martin Aldridge MLC highlighted limitations in the scheme's ability to provide adequate support for patients.

Vince said although PATS subsidies were widely acknowledged as vital for many regional patients, some aspects of the scheme - including its administration - were out dated and required contemporing to allow patients affordable access to quality healthcare.

"The motion calling for this review was supported strongly by my National Party colleagues and members of the opposition," Vince said.

"PATS needs to be improved to ensure regional patients are not disadvantaged when it comes to accessing medical services."

The terms of reference guiding the inquiry and subsequent report into PATS include:

- 1.) How adequately PATS delivers assistance to regional people accessing specialist medical care including:
  - The level of funding applied to the transport and accommodation subsidies provided;
  - Eligibility for PATS funding;
  - The administration process; and
  - Whether there is consideration of exceptional circumstances.
- 2.) Any incidental matter.

The Standing Committee on Public Administration plans to advertise the inquiry as soon as possible in order to allow detailed submissions to shape the inquiry.

"I will be encouraging constituents in North West Central to make public submissions by the May 16 deadline," Vince said.

"I am looking forward to the inquiry allowing PATS to evolve into a more contemporary and responsive program that continues to offer crucial assistance to regional patients."
