



# MURDOCH UNIVERSITY STERILISATION PROGRAM





#### CITRUS BAKED ROYAL RESERVE™ LAMB

JUICY ROAST WITH A SWEET AND SOUR LEMON ZING

PREPARATION TIME: 5 minutes
COOKING TIME: 1 hour 45 minutes

#### INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lamb leg or shoulder
- 2 tblsp orange marmalade
- 1 lemon, juiced and zest grated
- 2 tsp dried rosemary

#### METHOD:

- Preheat the oven to 180C. Prepare baste by warming marmalade with 1 tbsp lemon juice.
- Brush half the baste over the lamb, cover with foil and bake for 1 hour.
- 3. Remove foil, baste again and sprinkle with lemon zest. Cook for a further 30 mins. Rest 15 minutes before carving to retain juices.
- 4. Serve with roasted potatoes and a salad of roasted vegetables dressed with a squeeze of fresh lemon.

#### TIP:

Wrap any leftover meat in foil and plastic wrap and refrigerate immediately. Never leave meat to sit out at room temperature for long periods of time, any don't leave it in the turned-off oven overnight.



## ANZAC DAY 2014







ANZAC Day – 25 April

It was a very special ANZAC day in Yalgoo this year as the Shire's first Commemorative War Memorial was unveiled. Services were held at dawn and at 10.00 am. Visitors, relatives of men on the Commemorative Wall, attended from as far afield as Perth and Geraldton.

For the first time in Yalgoo's history, the National, State and Aboriginal flags were raised in front of the names of 216 young men and women of Yalgoo who have served in Australia's Defence Forces over the past 115 years. Of the 216 people listed on the wall, 19 young men lost their lives while serving their country.

The long over-due Commemorative Wall has finally come to exist four years after Council, (when recent past President Terry Iturbide was at the helm), resolved to build it in 2010. The idea of the Commemorative Wall was originally suggested by past President, Don Anderson.

It was apt that WA based military historian Sandra Playle was commissioned to undertake the research as she was raised in Yalgoo through the 1950s. We were honoured that Sandra accepted the invitation to fly to Yalgoo to be the guest of honour at our ANZAC services and it was also fitting that both Don and Terry could also participate in the services.

Sandra took the opportunity to present to Shire President, Cl Neil Grinham a reproduction of a renowned portrait of Corporal Jim Gordon V.C. who is acknowledged on our Commemorative Wall. Jim Gordon grew up near Gin Gin but was a resident of Yalgoo at the time of his enlistment into the Australian Army and it was felt fitting that he, as a recipient of the Victoria Cross in 1941, should finally be honoured in Yalgoo.







The theme is, 'Illuminate - Transparency, Trust, Transformation.





## Racial Discrimination Act

The issue of proposed changes to the Racial Discrimination Act has been in the news a lot lately. What is your view?

The following article is from the National Congress, an organisation formed to advance indigenous Australia.



# No case for change to the RDA, a fundamental racial protection

The National Congress of Australia's First Peoples rejects the Coalition Government's proposed amendments to the Racial Discrimination Act 1975 (RDA) and has called in its submission to the Attorney-General for the Exposure Draft of the Freedom of Speech (Repeal of Section 18C) Bill 2014 to be abandoned in its entirety.

The RDA is a key, if not foundational, law establishing Australia's identity as a nation upholding equality and tolerance within a diverse multicultural society.

The racial hatred provisions of the Act, contained in Part IIA and including Sections 18C, D and E, have functioned satisfactorily since being passed in 1995. They were introduced after long-standing and rigorous debate regarding the balance of freedom of expression and freedom from discrimination.

"Congress is concerned that change as proposed to these provisions would send a signal that racism is acceptable," said Congress Co-Chair Kirstie Parker. "We cannot justify racial vilification as a freedom. Our key objections include, but are not limited, to:

- No compelling case has been made to change the RDA.
- The draft Bill fails to achieve a proper balance between freedom of expression, a basic right that is strongly supported, and the right to live free from threat of harm through racial vilification and discrimination, another basic human right.
- The proposed definitions of 'vilify' and 'intimidate' in subsection 1 of the draft Bill are too narrow and inadequate in providing protection against racial discrimination, particularly if 'offend, insult or humiliate' were removed as proposed.
- The failure to restrict speech in virtually any context to what is "reasonable and in good faith" would be unacceptable.

 The draft Bill does not adequately recognise the often serious and profound harm – beyond the physical to emotional, psychological and/or social – caused by the public expression of racial hatred.

"The harm caused by racial vilification should not be dismissed," Ms Parker said.

"Even if not physical, this harm is very real and often extensive. It can undermine and ultimately destroy the sense of safety and security with which our peoples go about their daily lives.

"The cultural diversity of Australia's people is a great source of our nation's strength. Our government is obliged to protect and encourage social cohesion. At a time when the number of complaints of racial hatred to the Australian Human Rights Commission is on the rise, we need to maintain strong protections and we need national leadership on the issue.

"It is the virtual fabric of our society that we are focused on here, we must strive to be the best, healthiest and safest society we can be. We owe this to our children, grandchildren and future generations."

## Disability Access & Inclusion Plan

#### Yalgoo Disability Access & Inclusion Plan

All local governments in Western Australia are legislatively required to have a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP).

- Access to information
- Access to equitable service from staff
- Access to equitable opportunities to make complaints
- Access to equitable opportunities to participate in consultations

By consulting the community the Shire can be confident that it has taken into consideration all the views, thoughts and wishes of the community and therefore be better equipped to produce a relevant and proactive DAIP.





# What is National Reconciliation Week?



The week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements and to explore how each of us can join the national reconciliation effort.




