Seat Belts & Child Restraints

Just a little reminder on the requirements for traveling with children in vehicles...

Minimum age requirements for Child Car Restraints

Using an appropriate child car restraint can greatly reduce the risk of death or serious injury to a child in the event of a crash.

Birth - 6 months

Rearward facing restraint Capsule or rearward facing Convertible restraint

6 months - 4 years

Rearward facing restraint Forward facing restraint with a five point internal harness Forward facing Convertible restraint with a five point internal harness, or a Combination restraint used with a five point internal harness.

4 - 7 years

Forward facing restraint Booster seat with a lap sash seat seat belt Combination restraint used in a booster seat mode

A mob commissioned by the WA Department of Planning is doing a study on social infrastructure needs in our area. As usual, to be accurate and reflect the views of a community, they need as many people as possible to participate. So they have written a little blurb on their study with details about what it is and how to participate. So ... check it out and if it takes your fancy, give it a spin!

We are writing to you to request your participation in a survey for the Mid West and Gascoyne Social Infrastructure Requirements Study. This is a project commissioned by the Department of Planning

The Study aims to examine the social infrastructure needs within the Mid West and Gascoyne regions, and to develop recommendations for social infrastructure investment to meet the needs of the current and future population. As part of this Study, we are undertaking consultation with key stakeholders in the region through interviews and an online survey. Your organisation has been identified as a key stakeholder in the Mid West region and as such, we would appreciate your insight into the current level and utilisation of community facilities/services that you operate/deliver and whether there are any issues associated with meeting current or future demand.

It is our understanding that similar studies have been, or are being undertaken in the region. It is important to note, therefore, that this is a study commissioned by the Department of Planning and one that focuses solely on social infrastructure needs. For the purposes of this work, social infrastructure includes universal facilities and services such as education, health, recreation and sport, safety and emergency services, arts and cultural facilities, community centres and spaces as well as targeted facilities and services such as those for the elderly, youth, children, families, people with a disability and Aboriginal and culturally diverse people.

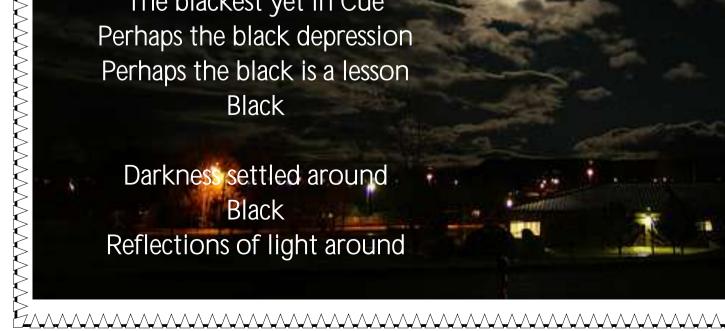

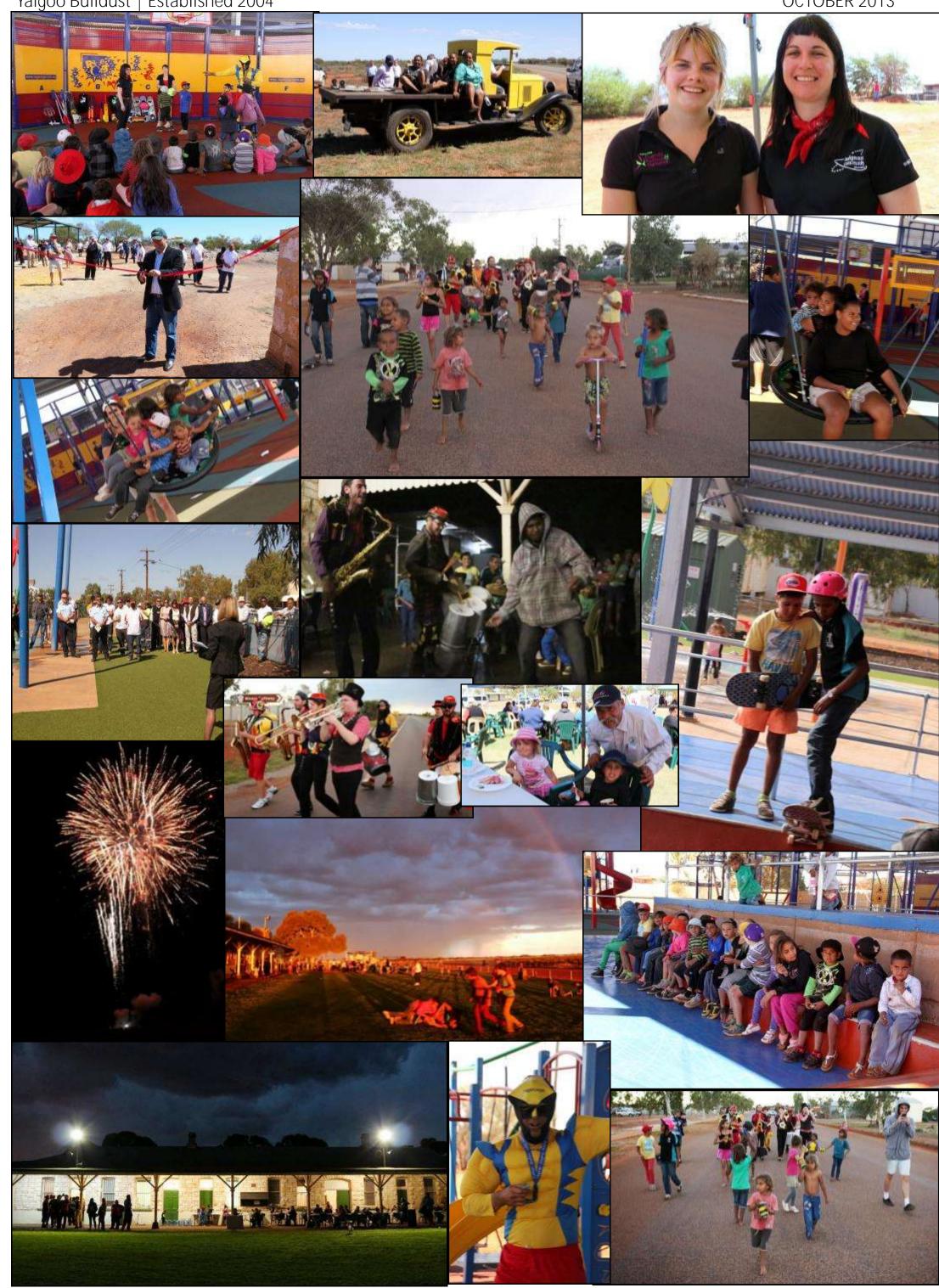

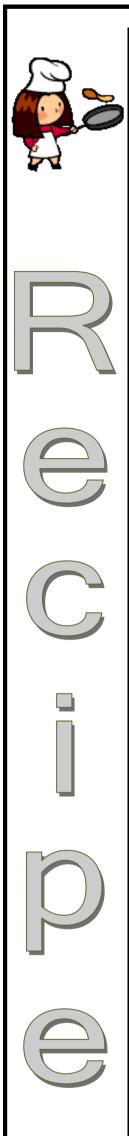

Baked fish fillets

These low-fat fish fillets are given a nutritious boost with the addition of healthy vegetables.

Ingredients

- □ 2 green onions
- I red capsicum
- □ 1 carrot
- □ 4 thick white fish fillets, (see note)
- 1/4 cup reduced-salt soy sauce
- □ steamed rice or cooked noodles, to serve

Step 1

Preheat oven to 200°C. Cut onions into 5cm lengths. Remove seeds from capsicum. Peel carrot. Finely shred all vegetables and place into a bowl. Toss until well combined.





Step 2

Line a baking dish with baking paper. Place fish fillets into prepared baking dish. Top each fillet with shredded vegetables. Drizzle with soy sauce. Season with salt and pepper.

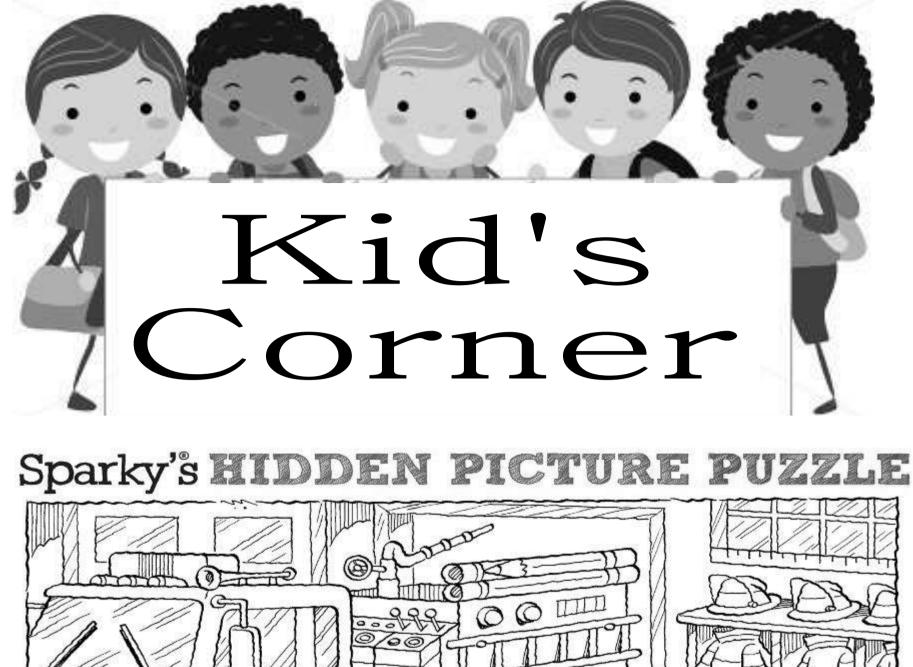
Step 3

Place another sheet of baking paper over fish. Fold all sides of baking paper together to form a parcel. Place dish into oven. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes, or until fish flakes when tested with a fork. Serve with rice or noodles.

Regional WA women invited to put best foot forward

Vince Catania, Member for North West Central, has encouraged women to nominate themselves to join an influential reference group that provides a leading voice for regional women.

The Rural, Remote and Regional Women's Network of WA was established in 1996 to bring women from regional areas of WA together to recognise, promote and expand the contribution they make to their communities. Nominations are now open to join the organisation's reference group, which comprises 15 members who are appointed for a three-year term from the beginning of next year.

Vince Catania encouraged women from North West Central who want to make a difference to put themselves forward.

"This diverse group plays an integral role ensuring the network stays in touch with developments in regional communities across WA," Vince said.

"Reference group members are part of an extended network of people promoting regional initiatives and events, highlighting current issues in their communities and providing strategic direction."

The reference group meets twice a year in Perth to review activities and develop future strategies for the RRR Network, which has a membership base of 7500 in WA.

Additional web-based meetings are also held during the year and the network connects members with its quarterly Network News magazine, monthly e-newsletter and social media.

Reference group chair Leonie Noble said joining the group offered a great opportunity to raise the profile of WA women, showcase their strengths and achievements and set the strategic direction of the RRR Network.

"As a member of the reference group you will bring your networks and local and regional knowledge to the table in order to raise issues that impact WA's rural, remote and regionally based women, their families and communities," she said.

Vince Welcomes Value Expansion to Pensioner Fuel Card

Vince Catania MLA, has welcomed a State Government announcement that Country Age Pension Fuel Card values will be increased to \$550 from 1st July 2014.

The \$50 increase, which will be made available to almost 50,000 fuel card holders, was announced by Regional Development Minister Brendon Grylls earlier this month.

Vince said Royalties for Regions would provide \$24.9 million in 2013-14 through the Regional Community Services Fund to raise the value of cards.

"The increase in Country Age Pension Fuel Card value was an election commitment from The Nationals WA and I'm proud to deliver good news to card holders in North West Central thanks to Royalties for Regions," Vince said

"It is a vital initiative that allows those living in eligible regional areas to access the card and remain mobile, contributing up to \$550 in fuel costs or taxi fares, or a combination of both to the same value."

The cards are available to anyone receiving a Centrelink Age Pension, Carer Payment, Disability Support Pension, Wife Pension or Widow B Pension or a Department of Veterans' Affairs Service Pension, Social Security Age Pension or Income Support Supplement.

Applicants must be living in non-metropolitan areas and cards are limited to one per couple.

The State Government plans to index the card value each financial year with Royalties for Regions committing more than \$116 million to the Country Age Pension Fuel Card over the next four years.

Vince said the scheme significantly lowered the cost of transport for regional pensioners and was now complemented by the Emergency Services Volunteer Fuel Card, also a National Party commitment at the State election.

"The Volunteer Fuel Card will provide up to \$2000 per year to eligible emergency service volunteer organisations around WA, with Royalties for Regions pumping \$5.6 million over four years into the program," Vince said.

"This recognises the lengths volunteers often go to, sometimes incurring expenses out of their own pocket, and will go some way to recognising this contribution."

More than 550 fuel outlets across WA are participating in the Country Age Pension Fuel Card scheme.

Eligible persons can call 1300 666 609 to find the nearest participating country post office and complete a Country Age Pension Fuel Card application form.
