From the CEO's desk

February 2012



Digital Television by mid 2013

The Shire currently operates a television rebroadcasting station which transmits analogue television to homes in the town of Yalgoo. This facility will become redundant when the network switches to digital in 2013.

To continue to receive television, households in Yalgoo will need to move to the VAST satellite TV service. Most households are entitled to a partial subsidy to have the VAST satellite dish and cabling installed. There is a householder contribution of approximately \$200 - \$350 however the Shire of Yalgoo will subsidise this cost to ensure that all households in the Shire will have equitable access to free to air television services.

Please make sure you check each edition of the Bulldust as there are steps that you will need to take in the coming year to make sure that you are included when VAST is installed in Yalgoo. The Shire will only fund the householder gap if you "opt in" when all households are transferred.

Note that the Shire will not provide televisions and the offer is only for private residences (not commercial or government).

Mobile Telecommunications for Yalgoo by mid 2014

Yes, the result of the government funded regional mobile telecommunication project has finally been announced and the news is good – Yalgoo is on the list.

Design specialists visited Yalgoo in early February to determine an appropriate site to locate the tower. Having considered various options, Council has approved the site of the existing television rebroadcasting station which is zoned Public

Purposes – Communication on the Yalgoo Local Planning Strategy.

This area has the advantage of being within reasonable distance from the optic fibre cable with access to the existing Telstra exchange and is surrounded by sufficient land for the spread of anchor points for the sixty metre high tower.

With such a readily available site, we can expect to keep our place in the construction queue to achieve mobile service in Yalgoo by mid 2014.

Be sure to check each edition of the Bulldust for updates about what you need to do to have satellite TV installed.

Mobile Telecommunications for Paynes Find - Mentioned but not Funded

I am advised that Paynes Find has been recognised on a secondary list however funding has not been allocated at this stage. Residents of Paynes Find may wish to continue lobbying for funding for your location.

Bushfire Debrief

A bushfire debrief (post incident analysis) will be held at the Railway Sporting Complex, 2:30 for 3:00pm on Tuesday 28 February 2012.

All persons who were actively involved in the emergency response during December and January are invited to attend to contribute to the analysis. Discussion will focus on what went well, what could be improved and what we have learnt to enhance our capacity to respond cooperatively to the next emergency.

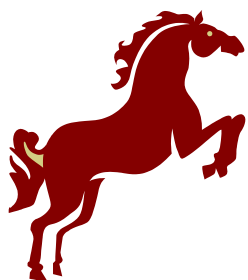

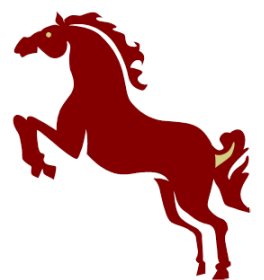

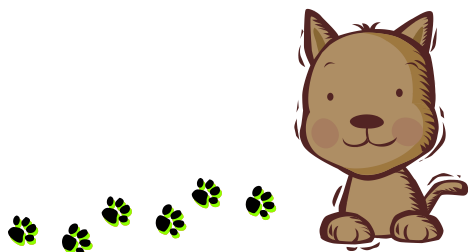

Reminder to all dog owners, that dogs over 3 months need to be registered. You are only permitted to have two dogs per house. You must be over 18 to own a dog. You are required to have suitable fencing to keep your dog in. Dogs are not permitted to roam around town either licensed or unlicensed. All dogs are to be on a leash while in public. The designated exercise area for dogs is at the railway complex. Fine breaches of the dog act are enforceable and are not cheap.

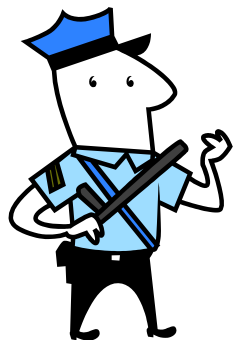

LOCAL DRUG ACTION GROUP

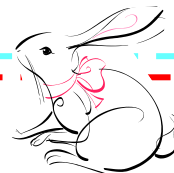


The Yalgoo Local Drug Action Group has put out a calendar high-lighting healthy life-style choices as opposed to abuse of drugs and alcohol.

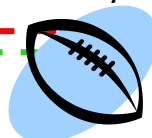
This message comes from our school kids and I would hope that everyone reflects on it.

A BIG THANK YOU



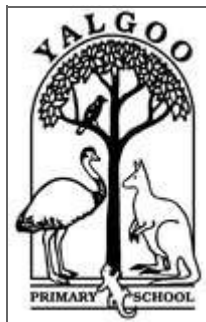

She will be away on Maternity Leave for some time and I wish her all the best in fulfilling her new role as a Mum.



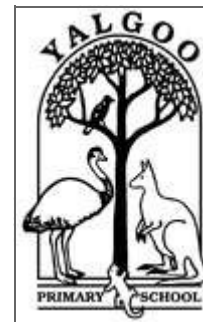

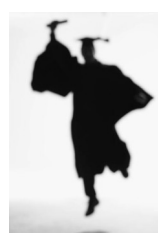

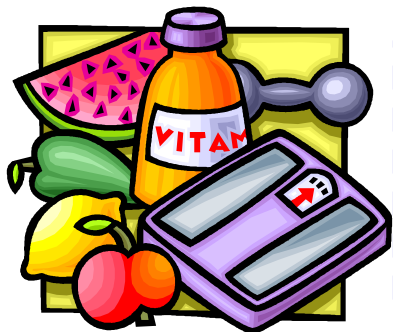

2011 was a busy year for the WACHS- Midwest Dietitians, especially in Yalgoo. For the first time our department welcomed the allocation of a full-time position to the Murchison (including Mullewa and Yalgoo). This meant more trips to Yalgoo were planned than in previous years, and some exciting new projects were started.

This year I was asked to contribute to the ladies cooking sessions that have been running monthly in Yalgoo. These cooking sessions have included informal education and interactive activities as well as healthy, yummy food! A Zumba class was also set up as a result of a community meeting early in the year, and I was able to contribute a Zumba DVD to the community.

The major focus for the second half of the year has been the Healthy Store Project with the Yalgoo store. With a grant made available through the Swap It, Don't Stop It campaign and much help from the Yalgoo community, especially the Yalgoo Primary School, we were able to design a series of "Shelf Talkers" that have been placed in the store. These signs identify the healthy options in the store and are supported by recipe cards and posters designed by the local children, as well as a plan for in-store cooking demonstrations in 2012.

The big launch of the shelf talkers was to happen during the Yalgoo Health and Community Services Expo planned for the 8th December 2011. Unfortunately, this event had to be cancelled as roads were closed due to bush fires. The shelf talkers have had a much more inconspicuous introduction to the store; however an official launch has been rescheduled for **10th February 2012**.

Hopefully you have seen the shelf talkers in store and are finding them useful when choosing healthy options! I welcome any feedback about the shelf talkers and whether they are working for you. If you have any other ideas for the store, please let me know.



I look forward to a busy 2012 in Yalgoo! Cooking sessions will be running monthly, I plan to run some more healthy eating sessions with the school children, there will be in-store cooking demonstrations and the shelf talkers will be continuously monitored and updated.

The big Health Expo and launch of the shelf talkers has been rescheduled for the **10th February 2012**. All visiting services and specialists will have stalls to promote their service. There will be a **free healthy BBQ lunch** for all to enjoy and prizes and giveaways all day. Look forward to seeing you all there!

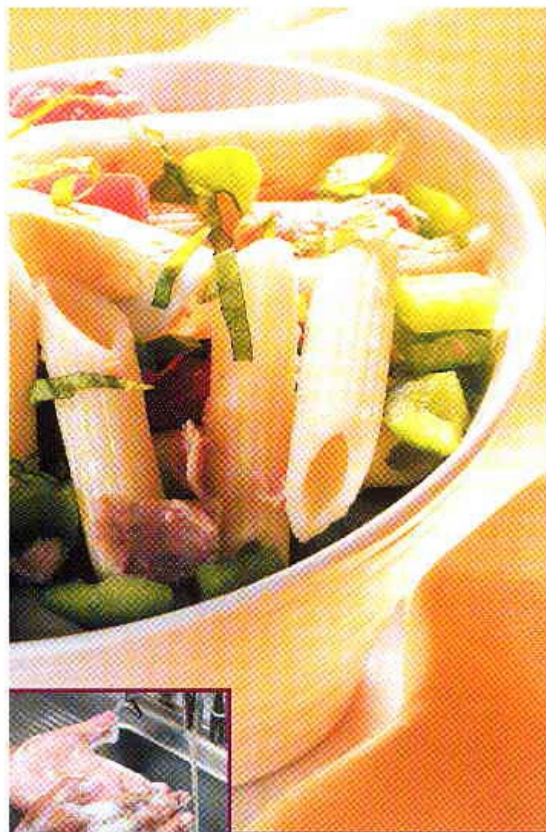

Put pasta into a large pot with plenty of boiling water and boil until soft.

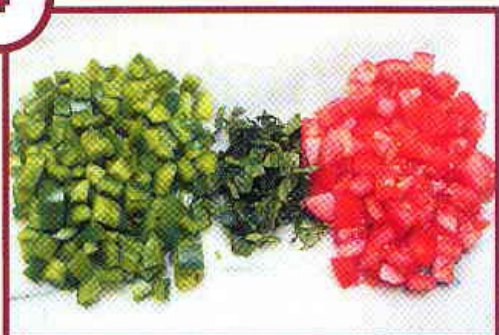

Drain the pasta and place in a serving bowl. Stir in the olive oil and vinegar or lemon juice.

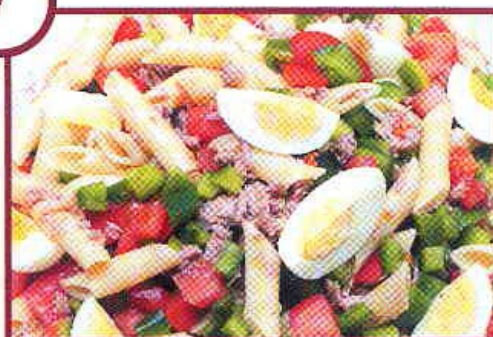
