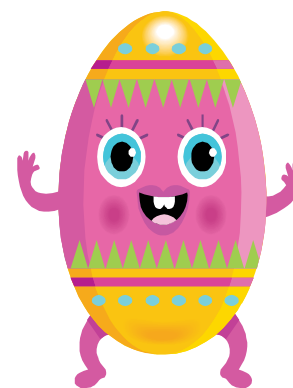

***Royalties for Regions* delivering improved mobile phone coverage**

- Northwest Coastal Highway to have extended mobile phone coverage
- Yalgoo and Gascoyne Junction will have mobile phone coverage

\$39.2 million *Royalties for Regions* investment to upgrade telecommunications

As a member of The Nationals WA I am proud that *Royalties for Regions* is delivering projects that are improving lives all over regional WA.

A significant project now underway is the \$39.2 million Regional Mobile Communications Project being delivered in the next two years. This project will enable our regional, rural and remote communities and businesses to gain access to a self-sustainable and affordable mobile voice and wireless broadband service.

The project is funded by \$39.2 million from *Royalties for Regions* and will deliver about \$106 million in value, deploying new mobile communications infrastructure at 113 sites throughout the state.

The upgrades will be positioned along major roads and highways and at several regional communities, improving mobile phone coverage and significantly boosting access to Next Generation broadband services.

The project will also deliver enhanced emergency radio and mobile telecommunication coverage, which will be a great asset to emergency services and WA Police in pursuit of their task. This project will improve public safety and potentially save lives.


FROM VINCE'S DESK

**YALGOO TO SHARE IN CSRFF GRANTS**

The Yalgoo Shire has received \$405,908 in funding for the installation of a "rage cage", a covering structure, a BMX track and Skate park as well as Tennis court resurfacing.

The grant is one of the 46 community sport and recreation projects State-wide funded through the 2012/13 Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF).

This round's successful applicants will share in a total of \$15,088,000 in funding.

Sport and recreation plays such a valuable role in all regional communities and I congratulate the Yalgoo Shire on their successful application. I look forward to seeing this particular grant make a big difference to the people living in the Yalgoo Shire, through both the improvements to the facilities and the benefits that come from increasing participation in sport and recreation.

The CSRFF provides Western Australian Government financial assistance to community groups and local government authorities to develop basic infrastructure for sport and recreation.

Grants of up to \$4million are available on a one-third contribution basis of the total eligible project cost. For more information on CSRFF grants, contact your local Department of Sport and Recreation office or visit www.dsr.wa.gov.au.

NEW RAIL PROGRAM FOR YALGOO RACE CLUB

The renaissance of picnic race meetings in Western Australia will be enhanced following an infrastructure program that will see a replacement and installation of running rails across the State, including Yalgoo race track.

I welcomed the announcement from Racing and Gaming Minister Terry Waldron of \$800,000 funding to install plastic safety running rails at Northam, Geraldton, Albany, Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Narrogin, Mount Barker and Lark Hill.

Mr Waldron said the initiative would have the dual benefits of meeting occupational health and safety needs at the seven bigger venues with the replaced running rails recycled at smaller courses and picnic venues across the State.

"By recycling the running rails to be replaced, it will allow those smaller clubs and picnic race venues that currently don't have sufficient railings to improve the safety of their facilities and attract better fields."

"The first distribution of rail from this latest roll out is earmarked for Leonora, Laverton, Leinster, Gascoyne Junction and Yalgoo with others to follow," he said.

The Yalgoo races are an important event for the community and I am pleased that we are able to benefit from this initiative.

STATE WIDE ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS INITIATIVES

Boarding Away from Home Allowance: helps secondary students from across rural and regional WA gain access to quality education.

Country Age Pension Fuel Card: provides \$500 a year, over four years, for eligible country pensioners to purchase fuel (i.e. petrol, autogas and diesel) and taxi fares.

Exploration Incentive Scheme: boosting mineral and petroleum exploration in WA.

Housing for Workers: \$200 million of *Royalties for Regions* to construct more than 400 Government Regional Officer Homes (GROH) in regional WA.

Patient Assisted Travel Scheme: provides assistance to regional residents with financial assistance when traveling more than 100km for medical reasons.

DRUGS

We continue to target illegal drugs with a search warrant being executed in Town. One female offender was charged in relation to possession of cannabis and a smoking implement.

A male person was also charged in Payne's Find for possession of a smoking implement and cannabis.

A routine traffic patrol resulted in a suspicious vehicle being stopped and a male person charged with possession of 28 small bags of cannabis. Another occupant of the vehicle was charged with possession of a smoking implement (Bong).

STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLES

We have been kept busy in Payne's Find lately with a number of persons charged with stealing a large quantity of property and also three motor vehicles.

One of the stolen motor vehicles was taken from a suburb in Geraldton and driven to a service station where the offender stole fuel before driving away.

PASTORAL THEFTS

We seem to be getting a spate of thefts from some of our pastoral stations with offenders stealing anything from alcohol and fuel to gates.



Again we need the help of the public to try and catch the people responsible for this type of behaviour. If you see anything suspicious please contact us.

Often that little bit of information is the "piece in the jigsaw puzzle" which on it's own may seem insignificant but when considered with other such leads gives us a pattern to work on.

FIREARMS

A male offender has recently been charged with "Fail to safe-keep a firearm" after police located his rifle in a wardrobe and not in the approved gun cabinet.

This serves as a timely reminder to everyone that firearms must be secured properly or else you risk the chance of prosecution if caught!

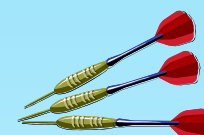

RECIPE:

Ham & Cheese Breakfast Casserole & Mini Mushroom-&-Sausage Quiches

Ingredients

6 servings

- 4 large eggs
- 4 large egg whites
- 1 cup non fat milk
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1 teaspoon minced fresh rosemary
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 5 cups chopped spinach, wilted (see Tip)
- 4 cups whole-grain bread, crusts removed if desired, cut into 1-inch cubes (about 1/2 pound, 4-6 slices)
- 1 cup diced ham steak, (5 ounces)
- 1/2 cup chopped jarred roasted red peppers
- 3/4 cup shredded Gruyère, or Swiss cheese

Active Time: 30 minutes

Total Time: 1 3/4 hours



Preparation

1. Preheat oven to 375°F. Coat a 7-by-11-inch glass baking dish or a 2-quart casserole with cooking spray.
2. Whisk eggs, egg whites and milk in a medium bowl. Add mustard, rosemary and pepper; whisk to combine. Toss spinach, bread, ham and roasted red peppers in a large bowl. Add the egg mixture and toss well to coat. Transfer to the prepared baking dish and push down to compact. Cover with foil.
3. Bake until the custard has set, 40 to 45 minutes. Uncover, sprinkle with cheese and continue baking until the pudding is puffed and golden on top, 15 to 20 minutes more. Transfer to a wire rack and cool for 15 to 20 minutes before serving.



1 dozen mini quiches

Active Time: 30 min

Total Time: 1 hour

Ingredients

- 8 ounces turkey breakfast sausage, removed from casing and crumbled into small pieces
- 1 teaspoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 8 ounces mushrooms, sliced
- 1/4 cup sliced scallions
- 1/4 cup shredded Swiss cheese
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 5 eggs
- 3 egg whites

Preparation

1. Position rack in center of oven; preheat to 325°F. Coat a nonstick muffin tin generously with cooking spray (see Tip).
2. Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Add sausage and cook until golden brown, 6 to 8 minutes. Transfer to a bowl to cool. Add oil to the pan. Add mushrooms and cook, stirring often, until golden brown, 5 to 7 minutes. Transfer mushrooms to the bowl with the sausage. Let cool for 5 minutes. Stir in scallions, cheese and pepper.
3. Whisk eggs, egg whites and milk in a medium bowl. Divide the egg mixture evenly among the prepared muffin cups. Sprinkle a heaping tablespoon of the sausage mixture into each cup.
4. Bake until the tops are just beginning to brown, 25 minutes. Let cool on a wire rack for 5 minutes. Place a rack on top of the pan, flip it over and turn the quiches out onto the rack. Turn upright and let cool completely.

INFORMATION SEMINARS run by Tim Wiley on:
“The Opportunities, Risks and Uncertainties for Carbon Offsets in WA’s Southern Rangelands”

The new Carbon Farming Initiative [CFI] legislation means that pastoral and indigenous land holders in the rangelands have an opportunity to earn income from carbon offsets from their land. A series of seminars are being held at across the WA rangelands on the issues surrounding the new carbon opportunities. Issues covered include;

- ❑ Carbon Farming Initiative (CFI) legislation,
- ❑ Issues & barriers to setting up an offset project in the rangelands,
- ❑ Carbon trading & markets for offset from the range lands,
- ❑ Carbon accounting methods,
- ❑ Carbon Rights, rangelands land tenure, Native Title,
- ❑ options for generating carbon offsets from the range lands,
- ❑ costs and economics of rangelands offset projects,
- ❑ current and proposed research on carbon offsets in the WA rangelands.
- ❑ new funding opportunities for trials and demonstrations.



There is now federal legislation in place to allow land managers to generate carbon offsets (i.e. through CFI) and to create a market for offsets (i.e. through the Clean Energy Futures). However uncertainty remains around some key issues regarding offsets projects from the rangelands. These seminars are designed so that pastoralists and indigenous land holders can make informed decisions on how they might progress to becoming involved in this new industry.

Carbon offset seminars will be run from the Murchison to the Kimberley. Dates and venues are still being confirmed. Contact your local Rangelands NRM regional Landcare facilitator for more details.

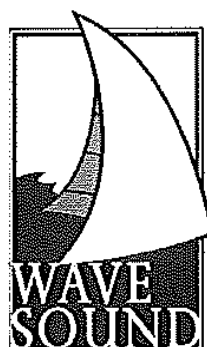

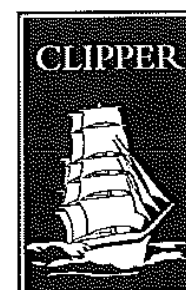
