

### **DANGEROUS DRINK DRIVERS FACE LICENCE DISQUALIFICATIONS**

The Road Safety Council has welcomed the announcement today by WA police and the Minister for Police; Road Safety, Liza Harvey MLA, that from 1 August 2012, drivers caught with a Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) of 0.08 and above or who fail to comply with a Police request to provide a sample of blood or breath for analysis will have their licence disqualified immediately under amendments to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

Professor D'Arcy Holman, Independent Chair of the Road Safety Council, said that the message to drivers was simple; blow 0.08 and you'll blow your licence.

"If we could eliminate drink driving, this year in WA we would save the lives of 55 people," Professor Holman said.

"If you drink and drive or take drugs and drive you are more likely to be involved in a crash and driving with a BAC of 0.05 doubles your crash risk while at 0.08 your crash risk is increased by seven times.

"First and foremost we must remember that the majority of the community do not accept drinking and driving and they do the right thing but we still have a problem where around 30 per cent of serious crashes involve illegal levels of alcohol."

The Road Safety Council is reminding WA road users that 'every police car is a booze bus' so not only is the risk to yourself and others not worth it, those who do drive with illegal alcohol levels are more likely to be caught and taken off our roads.

"The rest of the driving community deserves the right to be able to use our roads without the risk of being involved in a crash with a driver who has an illegal level of alcohol in their system," he said.

"We know that the immediate consequence of for drivers of losing their licence has an impact on driver behaviour.

"Deterrence is the starting point for awareness around the dangers of drink driving. Through high visibility and targeted patrols, Police will work to provide a presence on our roads "anywhere anytime" to deter people from drinking and driving and to apprehend those who do. Police efforts will be supported by community education to reinforce and remind people to do the right thing.

"For those who fail to heed the messages and choose to do the wrong thing, continued changes to penalties and suspensions act as a deterrent to discourage repeat behaviour," Professor Holman said.

The changes to the Road Traffic Act 1974 are part of a continued over all approach to addressing drink driving in WA. Disqualification notices are in line with the Road Safety Council's recommendations to Government for a Repeat Drink Driving Strategy (RDDS) which includes the introduction of alcohol interlocks.

"In addition to this current initiative introducing disqualification notices for certain drink driving offences, we would like to see the RDDS progressed through parliament in the future and will continue to support actions that complement the proposed program and contribute to a reduction in the incidence of drinking and driving on our roads." Professor Holman said.





## CHANGES TO NATIONAL POLICE CERTIFICATES

### Issue

Record of traffic convictions are now incorporated into National Police Certificates issued by the WA police.

### Background

Certified copies of traffic convictions are no longer available as a separate document and instead will be incorporated into the National Police Certificate.

Applications for National Police Certificates can be made through Australia Post or online by [CVCheck](#). The applicant's traffic conviction history will now be provided as part of this document.

If an applicant also requires their traffic infringement history, application can only be made directly through WA police.

Driver and Vehicle Services staff should be aware of these changes when advising applicants for F and T extensions, or driving instructor licences, of the required documentation.

Yalgoo Primary is 68th School to join the Passport Program network in Australia.

MMGGG will watch the establishment of the 'Yalgoo Passport Program' closely throughout 2012 and encourage the community too embrace the program to ensure that the children of Yalgoo receive the benefits that the program promises to deliver.



- **Midwest Life Education**

MMGGG has recently extended the sponsorship commitment to Life Education Australia (LEA) for a further three (3) years to ensure that this important education linked; life skills; healthy life styles; food and nutrition; drug and alcohol awareness; and resilience program will continue to be delivered in Yalgoo and other remote and regional Mid West schools.

The 2012 Mid West regional tour is scheduled to take place in term four (4) and will travel to Yalgoo; Mt Magnet; Cue; and Karalundi. The LEA teacher and the Life Education Healthy Harold resource van will be travelling to Yalgoo to deliver the program on Monday the 12<sup>th</sup> of November

### 2012 Yahoo Yalgoo

A number of MMGGG employees are currently in training for their annual fundraising walk from the Golden Grove mine site to Yalgoo. This event raises money for Variety the Children's Charity who granted monies in 2011 to support the first stage of the Yalgoo Youth Community recreation hub.

The 2012 Yahoo Yalgoo walk will take place on Sunday the 19<sup>th</sup> of August. Walkers will be aiming is to arrive at Yalgoo Railway Station at 3:00pm with a welcome BBQ and drinks between 4:00 - 6.00pm which community members are invited to attend.

MMGGG encourages you to put your walking shoes on to join the walkers for part of their walk. If you are interested in joining other community members and the Yahoo Yalgoo walkers for part of their fundraising

walk please contact Karen Malloch from the Shire of Yalgoo who has volunteered to coordinate community walkers' participation.

## Operations

### Copper Open Pit Progressing Well

Golden Grove's Copper Open Pit is quickly taking shape since operations commenced in January this year.

Since the arrival of the Komatsu PC 2000 digger in May and the addition of Open Pit contractor Alliance running night shift, productivity has increased significantly, and in late June the Open Pit team passed the 1 million BCMs mined mark – a milestone achieved with a zero Total Recordable Injury Frequency Rate (TRIFR).

Both the waste dump construction and grade control drilling are progressing well, and in May the first high grade azurite and malachite started to appear.

Other updates include:

- Results from the first round of grade control drilling compare favourably to reserve, meaning we should be able to deliver more ore at higher grade than expected for 2012.
- Year-to-date production is in line with plan and the first ore is expected to be delivered some time during the third quarter.
- Regulatory approval of the second stage of the Copper Open Pit was recently granted, allowing a cutback to commence later in this year. **Note:** *The Open Pit is being developed in stages to smooth the ore supply.*
- Hopes for another Open Pit have been raised, with drilling success occurring at the Tryall deposit (located north of the existing pit). This too will be followed up later in the year.

The Open Pit will provide an additional 3.3 million tonnes of copper ore reserves to the overall production profile of Golden Grove, and will produce approximately 235,000 tonnes of copper concentrate containing 59,600 tonnes of copper metal in concentrate at 25% copper. The Mill's capacity of approximately 1.8 million tonnes per annum will be maintained throughout the project.

## Environment

Golden Grove reported an environmental exceedence at the Lake Wownaminya discharge outlet. The Lake Wownaminya outlet pipe discharge limit was elevated above the selenium 0.02mg/L limit with a result of 0.026mg/L. The exceedence was reported to the Western Australian Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC). An investigation has been completed and corrective actions are in place to prevent the exceedence from re-occurring.

## Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Survey

Between April and June 2012, cultural heritage surveys were conducted at MMG Golden Grove with the Badimia traditional owners and Terra Rosa Cultural Resource Management, to facilitate exploration and development plans for the Bassendean Exploration Project and the Gossan Valley Expansion Project. The surveys were conducted in order to identify any Aboriginal heritage sites and obtain work clearances for proposed drilling and exploration. A number of Yalgoo resident traditional owners have been engaged in this important cultural heritage survey work including Percy Lawson Jnr.

MMG Golden Grove respects the local aboriginal, pastoral and mining heritage of the region and places great value on complying with its legal obligations not to disturb or destroy any heritage sites. Conducting cultural heritage surveys ensures MMG can obtain a clearer picture of any Aboriginal sites within its tenements, and also gives MMG the opportunity to engage with the traditional owners regarding ongoing heritage management on site. Further surveys are planned throughout the year for exploration on the northern tenements.

MMG Golden Grove is finalising negotiations of a Cultural Heritage Management Agreement (CHMA) with the Badimia People and Widi Mob traditional owner groups.

### Cross Cultural Awareness Training

In May 2012, the annual delivery of Cross Cultural Awareness (CCA) training courses commenced at MMG Golden Grove. The course has been delivered at Golden Grove with the support of Mrs Olive Gibson and Mr Victor Little since 1997. MMGGG also acknowledges the recent support of a CCA course by Temisha Hodder.

The one-day course is delivered by aboriginal people and provides insight into the unique culture of Aboriginal Australians. It provides employees with a deeper understanding of aboriginal history; knowledge; language; connections to country; heritage; and culture. It aims to help staff at Golden Grove better understand the local culture and to consider the diversity of cultures in the workplace so that they can communicate and interact more efficiently with our growing number of local aboriginal employees.

The CCA course also supports other MMGGG indigenous relations initiatives such as, the Bayalgu Indigenous Pre Employment Training Program, the Indigenous Employment Implementation Plan and any Cultural Heritage Management Agreements. Attendance by all MMG and contractor personnel at this course is compulsory.

### Bayalgu Indigenous Pre-Employment Training Program (IPETP)

The next Bayalgu Pre-Employment Training Course is scheduled to commence in early October 2012. Recruitment and Referral information for interested Yalgoo applicants will be made available through Victor Ware (MEEDAC) and at the Shire of Yalgoo office by mid August. The application information will also be available through Geraldton Job Services Australia (JSA) providers; Salvation Army Employment Plus; Mission Australia; and Skill Hire or Bundiyarra Jobs.

Following are the key dates for the next course:

- Applications in-6<sup>th</sup> of September
- Pre-medical testing for short listed applicants -12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> September
- Interviews for all short listed and medically cleared applicants- 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> September
- Applicants notification-25<sup>th</sup> September
- Course commencement- 8<sup>th</sup> October though until 14<sup>th</sup> December



# On the road to full-time work

The latest crop of indigenous mining cadets with MMG Golden Grove's specialist training program are weeks away from beginning a new chapter in their lives.

Seven students enlisted on the Bayalgu indigenous pre-employment training program have three weeks before they are released for full-time work.

Running for 10 weeks twice yearly, the program is organised by MMG and Duzack Institute of Technology.

Located 50km east of Geraldton, MMG Golden Grove's civil works training facility at Wicherina simulates a full-scale operation.

Located on farmland, the cadets cultivate their skills by operating professional plant machinery.

Trainer and co-ordinator Clint Henderson said call signs, safety regulations and checklists mimicked real-life work.

The two-way radios are abuzz with instructions and updates from the seven cadets as we drive around the grounds in Clint's ute.

The indigenous students perform the usual duties of any road-working outfit — driving loaders, diggers, small front-end loaders and other plant machinery.

Bayalgu aims to address skills shortages in industry, while giving indigenous workers the foundations to land full-time employment.

The program engages 13 organisations and employers including Giacci, Central Earth Moving and the Clontarf Mid West Football Academy.

As of March 31 this year, 85 per cent of Bayalgu graduates landed employment with MMG or one of the employment partners.

Malcolm Headland, 24, relocated to Geraldton from Armadale with his partner and three children to take on the Bayalgu course.

Malcolm was one of 60 appli-

cants to apply. He was unemployed for two years before entering the program.

Hopeful of one day becoming a loader driver, Malcolm said Bayalgu had taught him about the values of working life.

"I was sick of having no money and not being able to buy anything," he said.

"Doing something like this has taught me how you work for money and earn things."

Fellow student Tony Ronan, 45, is the father figure of the group.

He explained how the program helped him use his leadership skills with the younger students.

After years jumping from various jobs, Tony hoped to land full-time work once he finishes the course.

Graduates are awarded a Certificate II in Resource and Infrastructure. Each is then mentored for a period of 18 months. About 91 per cent get work during this period.


