#### Condolences to the Simpson Family

To the Simpson family, several of whom are employed by the Shire, I offer deepest condolences on the tragic passing of Daniel Simpson.

Daniel and others assisted Vic Ware to clean, tidy, paint and repair the Shire hall so that it could be used for the funeral of former Councillor Tom Hodder.

It is devastating that the hall was required so soon afterwards for Daniel's funeral.

I commend the Simpson family for the effort that you put in after the funeral and wake to leave the hall in a spotless condition; a credit to Daniel's memory.

#### 'Rage Cage' Progress Report

Funding agreements have now been signed and sealed for all of the funding for the rage cage and the Shire has issued an invoice to the Department of Regional Development and Lands for the first grant payment.

As soon as we receive the funds, we will issue a purchase order to the supplier, who will order the material and commence building the cage off site.

We expect the cage to be delivered early next year. In the meantime the Shire will start to remove the existing infrastructure and will prepare a tender for the roof structure.

The manufacturer of the children's playground element has offered a choice of different equipment so I will be asking Mums and children, through the school and playgroup, to have a look at the pictures and choose the one you think will be best for Yalgoo children. children and youth in Yalgoo to develop programs that will provide meaningful activities, and links to secondary and tertiary education.

The new CYDC will be working closely with you, the community, to determine priorities and work out how to bridge the many gaps in our community services.

#### Morawa Road

In May I reported that the Shire has made an application to use Country Local Government Fund Regional 2011-12 funds to seal the Morawa Road, although the application is outside the guidelines.

In August President Terry Iturbide and I met with Paul Rosair, Director General of the Department of Regional Development and Lands, who asked me to write to him to explain why RDL should consider an application that is outside the guidelines. I am pleased to advise that as a result, RDL has provided written support as the project is clearly regional in nature and the CLGF application is co-signed by the Shire of Morawa.

Note that this does not mean that the application is approved yet. The application and business case are currently with cabinet for their consideration and decision. There is no set timeframe for a decision once the application is with cabinet so now we can only wait.

In the meantime, the Shire has prepared and is about to seal a further seven (7) kilometres of the Morawa road. This leaves us with just 29 kilometres to seal. The construction team will commence preparations for the next ten kilometres immediately, funded by the Shire and the Regional Roads Group.

#### Mobile Phone Tower

#### Community and Youth Development Coordinator

I am pleased to announce that the Shire has offered the new position of Community and Youth Development Coordinator to a very experienced applicant who expects to commence in mid November.

This new position will provide a link between the community and the local government across all of our sectors including pastoral, mining and indigenous.



### Water Desalination Trial

The Water Corporation has recently completed comprehensive trials of two different types of water desalination plants in the Mid West Region.

The first, called High Efficiency Reverse Osmosis (HERO) was trialled at Yalgoo and the second, Electro Dialysis Reversal (EDR), was trialled at Wiluna. Both of these towns rely on water sourced from shallow bores to provide drinking water to customers.



The purpose of the trials was to compare the two different treatment processes in terms of their ability to improve aesthetic characteristics such as hardness and salinity, as well as a comparison of performance, reliability, cost and ease of operation.

The results of the trial showed the EDR system performed better than the HERO process across most of the performance criteria. As a result, the HERO plant at Yalgoo has been switched off whilst the EDR plant at Wiluna is still in operation.

### **Current Drinking Water Quality**

The quality of drinking water supplied in Yalgoo in terms of taste, hardness and salinity has reverted to the quality prior to the HERO trial. These characteristics of the drinking water result from the geology of the area from which the water is sourced and can only be improved by high level water treatment. It should be noted that the water is safe to drink.

It is recommended that bottle fed infants of 3 months of age or less use bottled water for formulas. The Water Corporation provides bottled water free of charge for this purpose, this is available from the Yalgoo nursing post.


### **Improving Water Quality**

The Corporation remains committed to improving the aesthetic water quality in Murchison towns through the provision of appropriate, cost effective water treatment systems.

The program to address aesthetic water quality in the towns of Wiluna, Yalgoo, Sandstone, Meekatharra, Mount Magnet and Cue is planned to recommence in 2013/14. This program will progressively deliver an appropriate treatment solution for each town.





#### NATIONALS WA BOOST COUNTRY AGE PENSION FUEL CARD, VINCENT CATANIA MLA

More than 45,000 regional pensioners could benefit from an increase to the Country Age Pension Fuel Card, if The Nationals WA retain the balance of power after the 2013 State election.

Member for North West and The Nationals WA Candidate for North West Central, Vincent Catania, said the Fuel Card increase – announced by Leader of The Nationals Brendon Grylls on Saturday – was a key commitment in the lead up to the next election.

"As part of our ongoing commitment to regional pensioners, the annual value of the Country Age Pension Fuel Card will increase in line with the CPI to about \$550," Vince said.

"This move will be welcomed by the thousands of regional pensioners who use the Fuel Card each day to remain active, mobile and engaged in their community."

Vincent Catania said 45,000 regional pensioners benefit from the Fuel Card each year, including more than 1100 in North West Central.

"Regional pensioners don't have access to the same public transport as their citycounterparts and often rely on private transport to attend medical appointments, go shopping or visit friends.

"The Nationals are addressing this inequality by delivering some assistance through the Fuel Card. I receive great feedback about the difference that the Royalties for Regions Fuel Card is making for pensioners in the North West."

Jacqui Boydell, Nationals WA candidate for Mining and Pastoral, said the Country Age Pension Fuel Card would continue to be a cornerstone of The Nationals WA policy platform for many years to come.


"This program is a much valued local initiatives which has improved outcomes for regional families, businesses and communities." Added Jacqui Boydell

# SECONDARY OPPORTUNITIES

Accessing secondary education in isolated areas has been an ongoing challenge for parents and educators alike.

The Morawa Eduaction, Industry and Training Alliance (MEITA) seized this challenge and identified a practical way in which they could provide the education needed without students having to leave the Midwest.

With an extensive upgrade at the WA College of Agriculture boarding faciliy in Morawa completed, a perfect opporuntiy arose for beds to be made available to students in outlying areas where secondary education was not readily accessible.

"Some students just don't have access to secondary education opportunities", commented WA College of Agriculuture Principal, Dean Carslake. " In Morawa we had the means to offer 12 beds at our recently extended boarding facility, and inturn have given students from year 10 to 12 the opputinity to continue their education at the Morawa District Highschool."

"We have been able to develop relationships with outlying communities, and parents of Yalgoo students have embraced this chance to have their children continue their education in the local area, " added Mr Carslake.

"Building on these relationships has the potential to see students from all areas that don't have secondary opporunties, commence their education in Morawa at a younger age and continue with further training and employment without leaving the Midwest."

2012 has seen MEITA successfully implement the availablity of the hostel beds to students from outlying areas, support from both the District Highschool, the WA College of Agriculutre and the broader community means that parents have greater choices available to them when considering their childs future educational needs.

### **OPR'S GOOD HEART PAINTS A PICTURE OF CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY**

Oakajee Port and Rail's (OPR) acclaimed Good Heart Mid-West Aboriginal Art Project has been announced the winner of the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) category in the Public Relations Institute of Australia's WA Section 2012 Golden Target Awards.

The category recognises organisations that aim to improve the quality of life of employees, communities and society at large - through programs extending well beyond statutory obligations or the business imperative.

Since its inception in 2008, Good Heart has seen more than 650 contemporary and traditional works from over 60 individual mid-west Indigenous artists showcased in a week-long exhibition in Perth's CBD.

The exhibition now attracts more than 5,000 visitors annually and, in five short years, well over \$400,000 have been generated in sales, which flow directly to the artists.

An exhibition preview, hosted by Geraldton Newspapers, has also been held in the mid-west for the past two years.

In recent years, select works have been accepted by the Art Gallery of WA (AGWA) for inclusion in its permanent art collection - and housed at the AGWA-funded Geraldton Regional Art Gallery.

"Good Heart has now reached the stage where the exhibition is highly anticipated by both collectors and artists alike," OPR Chief Executive John Langoulant AO said.

"At OPR we're proud to be playing a part, along with various local Aboriginal arts organisations, in helping establish a self-sustaining Indigenous arts industry for the region.

"We're just one of many government, community organisations and local businesses committed to this goal.

"This year we expanded the project, while trying to maintain the 'grassroots' approach which makes Good Heart unique."

Earlier this month, Mullewa artist Wendy Jackamarra and Geraldton's Margaret Danischewsky spent a week receiving intensive tuition at the Kidogo Art Institute in Fremantle after being announced as the inaugural recipients of artist development grants.
