LEMON DELICIOUS

Preparation time:

5 mins

Cooking time:

45 mins

Ingredients

Melted butter, for greasing 3 Tbsp unsalted butter 1 cup caster sugar 4 eggs, separated Juice of 3 lemons, strained Finely grated rind of 5 lemons 4 Tbsp self-raising flour 1 cup milk Extra 1 Tbsp caster sugar



Serves:

Method 45

- 1 Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease a 6-cup-capacity ovenproof dish. Whisk unsalted butter and caster sugar in an electric mixer on medium speed until well combined. Add the egg yolks one at a time and beat well after each addition. Add the juice and rind and beat to combine. Fold in the flour and milk.
- 2 Whisk the eggwhites until soft peaks form. Add the extra caster sugar and whisk until well combined. Add the eggwhites to the butter mixture and fold in until just combined.
- 3 Pour into prepared dish. Sit in a water bath and cook for 45 minutes. Serve immediately.

General Gardening Tips for October

- Fall is a great time to plant trees, shrubs, bulbs, perennials, grass seed and sod. Plants that are planted in the fall enjoy cooler temperatures and ideal growing conditions that allow roots ample time to grow into the surrounding soil. Be sure to a starter plant food at the time of planting.
- Plants and trees that provide color in the month of October include Burning Bush, Camellia, Ornamental Cabbage and Kale, Pansies Viburnum, Crape Myrtles, October Glory Maple, Red Sunset Maple, Nandina, Pyracantha, Sweet Gum and Virginia Creeper.
- There are lots of perennials with interest now including Anemone, Chrysanthemums, perennial Asters and ornamental grasses.
- Spring blooming fall bulbs are now in stock at local garden center locations and now is the time to plant them. Plant Iris, Tulips, Crocus, Daffodils and many others for glorious spring color.
- Add a touch of fall to your home and landscape with hardy Mums.
- Do not prune Azaleas, Rhododendrons and other spring flowering shrubs because they have already set their buds for next year's blooms. If you feel these shrubs do need to be pruned, however, you can prune them now, but you will sacrifice next spring flowers.
- Time to feed your plants with a good quality slow release plant food. Fertilizing perennials and flowering shrubs and trees with fertilizers made for flowering plants. This custom blended plant food contains slow-release nitrogen, sulfate of potash, iron and other micro-nutrients for overall plant growth and development.
- We recommend feeding evergreens (Hollies, Boxwoods and Yews) and deciduous trees (Maples, Oaks and Ash) with tree & shrub foods. These product contains slow-release nitrogen, sulfate of potash, iron and other micro-nutrients for overall plant growth and development.
- Time to dig Gladiolus. Remove the tops and let them dry for two weeks. Dust them with Sulfur. Store in dry peat moss or vermiculite at room temperature.

Time to transplant peonies or divide them if you wish to multiply your plants.

Lawns

- October is a great time to lime, seed and fertilize your lawn. You can seed a new lawn in early October or reseed (overseed) an established lawn this month to make it thicker and healthier.
- If you need to, you can lime, fertilize and seed your lawn all in the same day. Otherwise, seed and fertilize the same day and then lime later in the fall.
- If needed, fall is a great time to aerate and/or dethatch the lawn. If you decide to do one or both
 of these, they should be done prior to seeding.
- If you do plan to aerate, dethatch or rototill (for total renovation), thoroughly soak the soil a day
 or two before you start your project or perform your project a day or two after a good rain.
- Now is also a good time to control weeds growing in the lawn, however you cannot weed kill and seed the same day. If you choose to kill weeds in the lawn first, you must wait three weeks to seed your lawn. Or, if you seed first, you will need to wait until the new seed has germinated and been moved at least twice before applying a weed killer.
- If you want to prevent winter annual weeds from germinating in the lawn, you can apply Gallery
 or Portrait in early October, but this would prevent you from seeding now. You will have to wait
 60 days to seed, which means you would probably need to wait until spring to seed the lawn.

Tips on applying weed killer:

- Do not apply weed controls on newly seeded areas.
- Do not apply weed controls on windy days.
- Do not apply weed controls near or on the edge of waterways.
- Do not apply weed controls when temperatures are above 85 degrees F.
- Do not allow children or pets to play on lawns freshly applied with weed controls. Wait until
 weed control is dry if you applied a liquid weed killer. If you applied a granular weed control,
 wait one week.

Always check the label of weed control products and follow the labeling





Feeding the Lawn

- Fall is the best time to feed your lawn with a good quality, slow-release lawn food, with at least two feedings between the months of September, October, November and December. We recommend using a 26-4-12 weighted fertilizer in September. Follow the directions EXACTLY.
- If you are seeding or sodding the lawn, use a 14-18-14 weighting. It is high in phosphorus, which aids in seedling germination and encourages strong root development. If you use 14-18-14 now, follow-up with a 24-4-12 in November or December.

If you are not seeding or sodding, use a 26-4-12 weighted fertilizer. It is the ideal fertilizer to help green -up your lawn and keep it looking thick and healthy. This product is high in nitrogen, which will continue feeding the lawn over an extended period of time. If you use 26-4-12 now, follow-up with 14-18-14 in November or December as a root-building winterizer.

Seeding the Lawn

As mentioned, October is the best month to seed your lawn with improved varieties of quality grass seed. We recommend you use grass seed mixes which have been specially formulated for your area.

Bluegrasses and Fine Fescue and will grow in conditions ranging from full sun to 50% shade.

Seeding rates are as follows:

3 lbs./1,000 sq. ft. on new lawns.

1.5 lbs./1,000 sq. ft. when overseeding.

Fine Fescues and hard Fescues and will grow in conditions ranging from 50% shade to 90% shade.

Seeding rates are as follows:

4 lbs./1,000 sq. ft. on new lawns.

2 lbs./1,000 sq. ft. when overseeding.

A blend made up of tall Fescues and a touch of Bluegrass and Ryegrass thrives in conditions ranging from full sun to 70% shade, and can take all kinds of soil condition (wet, dry, clay, sandy).

Seeding rates are as follows:

8 lbs./1,000 sq. ft. on new lawns.

4 lbs./1,000 sq. ft. when overseeding.

Fruit and Vegetable Gardens

• Pick the largest, almost ripe green tomatoes, just before a frost. Put them in a brown paper bag with some apples and they will ripen as sweet as if on the vine.

Remove all old vines of beans, squash, etc. to the compost pile and then spade or till the garden. Sow winter rye and do not mow it.

House Plants

- Time to bring houseplants back indoors if you haven't already. If needed, spray them first with one of the following products: Schultz Houseplant Spray, Safer Houseplant Spray or Orthene. You can dust the soil with insecticide granules to prevent bringing in ants, wireworms, sow bugs, etc.
- Repot pot bound plants with potting mix.
- Fertilize your houseplants with a slow release fertilizer like Osmocote through November, and then slow down your feeding schedule until February.



Members of the public were invited to register written questions prior to the meeting. Members of the Paynes Find community registered a number of questions and asked further questions from the floor.

The President asked the CEO to respond relevant to the operational area concerned and a number of questions were taken on notice.

RESPONSE TO QUESTIONS TAKEN ON NOTICE

Mr Kim Cable:

- Q: Are the [Shire of Yalgoo] council going to erect "No Shooting" signs on the highway and main access roads entering into the community of Paynes Find?
- A: This question was taken on notice.

 Enquiry revealed that Council considered this matter at the November 2010 meeting of Council. A motion to erect signs was put and lost (C2010-1114/ S2010-1105).
- Q: What are the future plans for the [Paynes Find] rubbish tip?
- A: This question was taken on notice.

 In the short term, the site will be cleaned up in due course in keeping with the Shire works program. Plans for the longer term will need to be based on inspection and commissioning of a report including advice from various government departments and the Shire's Environmental Health and Building Officer for consideration in the Shire's integrated planning process.

Mrs Leah Bell

- Q: How often will Ninghan Station access road be graded?
- A: This question was taken on notice.

 The Ninghan Station Access Road is constructed in a major water course and regularly has wash outs and damage from minor rainfall events. The road is programmed to receive a maintenance grade once a year.

Mr Don Anderson

- Q: How often will Thundelarra Station access road be graded?
- A: This question was taken on notice.

 The Thundelarra Access road is programmed to receive a maintenance grade once a year on one of the access roads.

QUESTIONS WITHOUT NOTICE

Mr Don Anderson

- Q: Who is responsible for and when can the road sign be changed for "Road Open" [at the Mount Magnet end of the Yalgoo-Ninghan Road]?
- A: The Shire is responsible for this sign. Specific queries or reports regarding the status of the sign should be directed to the Shire during business hours.

- Q: When can the white posts be replaced at the narrow concrete creek crossing north of Muralgarra turn off?
- A: This matter was inspected on 20 September and the appropriate action is under review.
- Q: When can the large scrub on the narrow bitumen north of the Muralgarra turnoff [be cleared]?
- A: This work was completed on 19 September 2012.
- Q: When can hole in centre of road south of Thundelarra [be fixed]?
- A: This damage was under repair at the time of the meeting and was completed on 20 September 2012.
- Q: When can the last grid towards Ninghan on bitumen ½ closed road for last 18 months [be fixed]?
- A: This work was programmed for October and was completed on 5 October 2012.
- Q: When can unsealed section [Yalgoo Ninghan Road] be graded?
- A: This work was programmed for October and was completed on 7 October 2012. Specific queries should be directed to the Shire office during business hours.
- Q: Does the Shire still have a policy in place for grading of airstrips?
- A: Yes (policy 13.2 airstrip grades). This policy provides for one only free grade annually provided that the work is carried out at a time when the council graders are working within the area. Only one airstrip is eligible for each holding, individual station or collective. Specific queries should be directed to the Shire office during business hours.
- Q: Who is in charge of signs regarding the Shire of Yalgoo?
- A: The Shire of Yalgoo is generally responsible for signage on Shire Roads. Specific queries should be directed to the Shire office during business hours.
- Q: How is traffic counted on the Yalgoo Ninghan Road and who is in charge of the traffic counters?
- A: MMG Golden Grove own three (3) counters that are permanently in use at the mine entrance for the purpose of determining traffic flows to the mine.

Mr David Rocke

- Q: Can the Council advise me as to the correct protocol to follow if I am unhappy with the conduct of the Shire and its representatives?
- A: CEO Sharon Daishe responded that Council Policy 3.8 (Complaints) outlines the procedure for formal complaints and offered to have a copy of this policy forwarded to Mr Rocke.

Ms Gail Pilmor

- Q: Please advise what actions the community of Paynes Find should take to resolve operational issues not resolved?
- A: CEO Sharon Daishe advised that the Shire has appointed a Community and Youth Development Coordinator (CYDC) who commences in November and that in due course this person will be the liaison officer for matters concerning the Paynes Find community. In the meantime operational matters may be reported to the Shire office during business hours. Operational matters are addressed in order of priority and delays at Paynes Find can be expected due to the extreme distance from Yalgoo along with staff availability and workload. Shire policy 3.8 outlines the procedure to lodge a formal complaint.

- Q: When and where will the new job position for a Caretaker at Paynes Find be advertised?
- A: This part time position will be advertised in the Yalgoo Bulldust and by way of flyer to members of the Paynes Find community. The position will be advertised in 2013 after the positions of Supervisor Town Maintenance Parks & Gardens and CYDC have been filled and the incumbents are settled in their respective roles.
- Q: Is there a Job Description available for the new Caretaker position and will it incorporate airstrip management and general caretaking of Paynes Find?
- A: A vacancy information package will be prepared before the part time position is advertised and this will include the job description. It is intended that the part time caretaker position will carry out a range of minor tasks related to the position of caretaker including mowing, cleaning ablution facilities and inspecting the Paynes Find airstrip. The caretaker will operate under the direction of a staff member of the Shire of Yalgoo and will not be responsible to members of the Paynes Find community or other members of the public.
- Q: Is there a management programme for the access, maintenance and signage for perimeter roads around Paynes Find?
- A: Shire Policy 13.3 Road Asset Management Priorities clarifies the level of maintenance and attention that is to be given to roads under the Shire's responsibility. This policy was published in the Yalgoo Bulldust following a previous enquiry from the Paynes Find Community (refer pages 6-11 of the Nov/Dec 2010 edition) The CEO indicated that this information will be repeated in a future Bulldust. Specific queries should be directed to the Shire office during business hours.
- Q: How can the communication channels between the Paynes Find community and the Shire of Yalgoo offices be improved?
- A: CEO Sharon Daishe answered that she acknowledges the frustration of members of the Paynes Find community due to a number of minor operational matters that have remained outstanding. She advised that staff shortages, back to back natural disasters and high workloads have meant that Shire staff have been unable to escalate minor operational matters at Paynes Find above competing business critical priorities. She thanked the Paynes Find community for their understanding and drew attention to the information that had been provided during the morning workshop prior to the council meeting. This information included the fact that the Council had resolved to appoint new positions of Community & Youth Development Coordinator, and Paynes Find Caretaker (part time). Although the issue will not be resolved in the short term, these new positions comprise a strategy to provide an improved level of service and higher level of community satisfaction at Paynes Find in the longer term.

Ms Lisa Schmidt

- Q: What is going to be done regarding the culvert at the entrance to the community centre?
- A: In due course the drain will be extended and the corner removed so that the entrance is a T-section.

Mr Kim Cable:

- Q: Who is responsible for the maintenance/repair and erection of road signs adjacent to the main roads in Paynes Find the Paynes Find community, the Shire of Yalgoo or Main Roads WA?
- A: Main Roads WA are responsible for maintenance/repair and erection of road signs relating to the main road.
- Q: Who is responsible for signs that have been pushed over?
- A: This would depend on the location and nature of the sign. Specific queries should be directed to the Shire office during business hours.

Mrs Rhonda Anderson:

- Q: Why are road signs left behind after completion of work?
- A: The generic nature of this question precludes an accurate answer. Specific queries regarding signs should be directed to the Shire during business hours and include details such as date, location, type of sign etc.

The following Shire of Yalgoo policy extract is provided for your interest as a result of discussions with the Paynes Find community.

Shire of Yalgoo Road Asset Policies and Road Hierarchy

13.3 Road Asset Management Priorities

Introduction The purpose is to clarify the level of maintenance and attention that is to be given to

roads under the Shire's responsibility.

Objective This Policy is intended to provide guidance as to –

 the level of importance of each road, to assist with planning of future construction and general maintenance of the road system

- the frequency and level of maintenance for each road

priority of works

History Adopted 18 June 2009

Policy Statement

The following Schedules are adopted, and form part of this Statement –

Policy Schedule 13.3 (a) – Main Roads WA Road Listing

- Policy Schedule 13.3 (b) - Road Use and Priority Listing

Policy Schedule 13.3 (c) – Road Use and Priority Codes

Policy Schedule 13.3 (d) – Main Roads Cross Section Types

The general order in which works should be undertaken are –

1st urgent works where road conditions are unsafe, or could be considered to be unsafe

2nd flood / storm damaged roads brought to an adequate standard (i.e. fit for use as defined by MRWA), but not necessarily being up to the desired standard

3rd construction works funded wholly or in part by grants or contributions

4" construction works required prior to grant works being done

5th general maintenance

- Generally, the higher priority road, as defined by Policy Schedule 13.3 (b) should take precedence over lower priority roads.
- 4. The Frequency and Priority assigned to the roads in Policy Schedule 13.3 (b) are guides, not fixed requirements, and vary according to conditions and need.
- It is acknowledged that
 - the Shire has a responsibility to maintain all roads in the Shire that are open to public use, not
 just the main access routes
 - conditions can vary over the whole of the Shire, and roads may need to remain or be left in a rough but safe condition, in order to attend to higher priority works needed elsewhere
 - simply being rough is not sufficient reason to incur the extra costs in relocating the works crew from one road to another, out of the cycle of the planned work
 - flood / storm damage, additional tied funding for works etc, will interfere with the general cycle of maintenance grading, and will necessarily delay general maintenance works





COMMUNITY NOTICE

Dog Registration Due by 1 November

All dogs over three (3) months of age must be registered. Dogs should be registered with the Council where they normally reside. Should you move within the State, you do not have to reregister your dog, but the change of address must be given to the Council where the dog is currently registered. All registrations are due on the first of November each year and run either one year or three years.

Registration helps you to recover your dog if lost and assists the Council to encourage responsible dog ownership and provide services to dog owners for the benefit of the entire community.

A person under 18 years of age may not lawfully register a dog in his / her name. The dog must be registered by a parent or another adult who will then be regarded as the lawful owner.

Upon production of a Pensioner Concession Card or both a Commonwealth and State Seniors card pensioners may register their dogs for half the prescribed fee.





Shire of Yalgoo Forward Capital Works Plan

PLAYGROUND/PARK PROPOSAL

In 2010 after consulting with community about projects and priorities the Shire developed a plan for future capital works. The Shire is now reviewing this plan.

Shamrock Park is very popular but the playground equipment is old and broken. There is also not enough shade and there is no seating or drinking water. The equipment doesn't meet modern safety standards, so repairing it is a problem. Children tend to run across the main road between the unfenced hall and the unfenced park.

Councillors inspected the park in September 2012 and have proposed an alternative solution.

Proposal to revive Heritage Park


Next to the Yalgoo Hall there is land that used to be a park with a heritage theme. It still has many shady trees and a commemorative plague.

Council is considering whether to redevelop Heritage Park instead of Shamrock Park. Heritage Park is bigger in area than Shamrock Park and it is on the same side of the road as the hall, which makes it safer and more convenient.

The proposal for Heritage Park would include:

- Move the entrance to the Shire works depot away from the side of the hall. This would separate the hall (community) from the depot (workplace) to improve safety.
- Retain the access to the back of the hall for parking (not through-traffic).
- Rebuild the fence in front of the hall to keep children safely away from the road.
- Revive the park beside the hall with lawns/gardens, shade and seating.
- Add children's play equipment with a heritage theme.
- Remove the old play equipment from Shamrock Park and use this area for other purposes.

This work would be done in approximately 2015 depending on funding.





Note that a NEW modern playground will be built in 2013 next to the water park (part of the rage cage project)
