

From the CEO's Desk

Project Update.

- 1. The Arts Centre project contract has been completed and will commence as planned and should be finished this financial year.
- 2. Widening of Yalgoo/Morawa Rd should commence in the next few months. This will widen the seal to 7 meters and we hope to get about 30km done in the first year from the Yalgoo end.
- 3. Re-sheet and widen Jokers Tunnel Rd has been completed by our works staff.
- 4. Quotation has been received for works on Ninghan Rd to repair worn/damaged seal particularly in floodways.
- 5. New LED floodlighting has been installed in the Rage Cage. These lights offer greater resistance to the vandalism and damage that has occurred previously.



Plant and Equipment.

A new concrete batching plant from Queensland has been delivered along with a second hand agitator truck from Victoria. This equipment will enable us to supply our own concrete at a suitable price to carry out many of our capital and maintenance projects in an efficient manner.





A replacement Works truck has also been received. The new truck is automatic and has a modified tray to enable safe access to the back tray for staff.



Shire Award!

Myself, Neil and Raul travelled to Perth to accept an award from the Public Health Advocacy. This award was won due to the Bicycle Safety program recently run by the Community Development Officer in conjunction with Yalgoo Police. This program was recognized above other entries from the City of Kalgoorlie and City of Geraldton. Well done to all those involved including the participants!

Current Funding Applications in the System

1. Royalties for Regions Mid-West Development Commission Funding

Name of Project: Yalgoo Arts, Culture and Information Centre

A funding application was submitted in September 2016 to the Mid-West Development Commission for the establishment of the Yalgoo Arts, Culture and Information Centre. Currently the women occupy one small room in the MEEDAC building. The room is constrained by its size and community members are hindered in their attempts to engage in and promote the arts, crafts and culture within the community.

The proposed Centre will play an important role in providing an environment that is suitable for art and craft activities, workshops, and the exhibition of works created by community members. The Centre will offer an opportunity for all community members (in particular women and children) to participate in the arts and culture space, showcasing a diverse range of mediums and creative responses to the unique location of Yalgoo.

Update: The Shire has been informed that they will hear in the near future as to the outcome of the funding application.

2. Department of Sport and Recreation

Name of Project: Up Grade Sports Oval.

An application was developed and submitted to the Department of Sport and Recreation for the upgrade (the first stage) of the Yalgoo sports oval in late August 2016.

Update: The Shire has been notified that it should hear from the Department of Sport and Recreation in the near future as to the result of the application process.

3. Regional Events Scheme: Tourism WA

Name: Yalgoo Emu Cup Fund Day and Family Concert (2017).

An application for funding was submitted in late 2016 for funding to run the 2017 Yalgoo Emu Cup Fund Day and Family Concert. The event engages community and visitors in an annual festivity.

Update: Success of application will be known later in 2017

4. Lotterywest

An application for funding to Lotterywest is currently being developed to contribute to the costs of landscaping the entry area of the proposed Yalgoo Arts, Culture and Information Centre. It is proposed that the landscaping will be visually appealing, consisting of native plants, dry creek bed and small bridge – adding to the aesthetics of the proposed centre.

5. Lotterywest

An application to Lotterywest is currently underway for a contribution to the Yalgoo Emu Cup Fun Day and Family Concert.

6. Building Better Regions – Department of Industry, Innovation and Science (Commonwealth) Community Scheme

An application to Lotterywest is currently being developed for a contribution to the Yalgoo Emu Cup Fun Day and Family Concert.

7. Building Better Regions – Department of Industry, Innovation and Science (Commonwealth) Name: Paynes Find Upgrade Parking Bay

An application has been developed to request for major funding through the Department of Industry, Innovation and Science Building Better Regions Scheme.

It is proposed the funding will be used to seal the existing rest area for articulated vehicles, caravans and motor vehicles that stop at the Paynes Find Roadhouse. The project will also provide for

- demarcation zones Trucks; Caravans; and general vehicle bays/zones, thus addressing road safety/ traffic issues in and around the Roadhouse, and
- Pop up information Centre to assist travellers in planning their journey

Update: Applications for funding round opens 18 January 2017.

8. Building Better Regions – Department of Industry, Innovation and Science (Commonwealth) – Infrastructure Scheme

Name: Housing

An application for funding for government housing (two units) is currently being undertaken and will be submitted for consideration in February 2017. The funds will assist in the complete construction of 2 x staff units on one block.

Men's Group



Thank you to the Shire for the support you have given to get this project up and running, we now have a building we can be based in; we have the tools to create and fix things, with a bit of elbow grease we can set us up a work shop that caters for the young men and their fathers. The idea here is to make us a place that we can teach and learn from each other, to build a place that we can share with the communi-

ry, a place that gives us the opportunity to take on new tasks and skills. The main focus for the men who have been nvolved with the men's group over the last year has been to create a place that gives the young men and boys of Yalgoo a chance to grow and learn. The goal is to stare our young men away from the temptation that exists when one is board or being influenced by peer pressure to commit crime on their community and family. May be we haven't done that well in the past achieving this goal, however this is a new year, we now have the tools and building to make something happen. Do we wait to lose more of our children to the system based on their bad choices, or do we create a place and work towards a place where the young people look after their own and everything we hold dare.

Play Group

Will be open as usual from Wednesday the 1st, we will have a new time table available for parents on this day. For all the parents of pre-schoolers in town bring the babies down so they can have social time with their peer group, we nave resources here for to use with your child to enhance their ability to learn.

REMEMBER PARENTS ARE THE FIRST TEACHES OF THEIR BABIES, 200 YEARS AGO YOU WOULD HAVE TAUGHT YOUR CHILDREN EVERTHING THEY NEEDED TO KNOW TO SURRIVE IN THE WORLD THEY WERE LIVING. IF WE TAKE THIS CONCEPT AND APPLAY IT NOW, THE ONLY REAL PLACE WE CAN DO THIS IS AT HOME, KINDY OR PLAY GROUP.

You have the chance to be part of the new direction we might take our play group, the shire has managed to source out funding for a new play centre, the time is now for us to put the hard work in, and when we move we will nave a clear direction and plan for the children of Yalgoo and what we need to do to make it happen.



- 7. Entering personal spaces with respect




Bottled water for bottle-fed infants less than three months of age

YALGOO COPS ON THE BEAT

The last 3 months have been exciting watching the new police station take shape every day something different was happening and then I finally got the keys and it's been absolute

awesome adventure from there on.

The opening took place on the 3rd November 2016, we had the Honourable Liz HARVEY Deputy Premier attend and officially open the station.

The only disappointing part of the day was people building up plates for takeaways, the food was awesome but unfortunately there were a few who missed out because of those few who took it upon themselves to take enough food for breakfast, lunch and dinner, I've never seen that before, must be a Yalgoo thing.

Crime continues to rise in Yalgoo with a steady amount of burglaries, stealing and damage offences, the most significant being the burglary on the Yalgoo Hotel where a large quantity of alcohol and cigarettes were stolen along with a large amount of cash.

I spoke about the store getting burgled in the last edition and now we're talking about the Hotel, what next? And unfortunately again it is allegedly our local youths that are involved again, unbelievable why these people would provide an excellent service to the community when the minority of this community steal their profits and destroy their hard work.

Our Xmas road traffic campaign has come to an end and thankfully I can say there were no loss of lives or serious injuries to anyone in the community, although I did personally issue 7X infringements for seatbelt offences to locals in Yalgoo and when you think there was only around 100 people in the community those figures are quite alarming.

If you drive around Yalgoo without a seatbelt, licence or un-roadworthy vehicle then you are going to infringed or spend a day in court, just because you only drive a short distance is no excuse and will not be tolerated.

Police officers are police officers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, we are not paid at that rate, but whether we are in uniform or plain clothes we are police officers and if we see offences being committed during those times we will act on those. There are some individuals in Yalgoo who seem think we can't act when not on duty, trust me we can and we will.

As we are only early into 2017 let's all pledge to make Yalgoo a safer place, you know who the criminal element in town is, most of you are probably related to these people who are selling drugs, committing burglaries etc. it's time for you to approach them and say enough is enough and dob them in to your local police.

I have been here now nearly 2 years in March this year, that is my tenure and I will be leaving once I secure a position. We have met some nice people.

When police officers come to a small community they bring their families and want to become part of the community so when the next Officer in Charge comes here please make him/her feel welcome.

As we are now writing these editions every 3 months this will be my last at Yalgoo so I wish you all the best for the future.

Yalgoo Caravan Park Update


Since our last publication we have had some activity at the caravan park in terms of works completed.

New lifesaving RFDS aircraft for the north-west

11th January 2016

The Royal Flying Doctor Service is set to significantly expand its aeromedical servicing capacity across the North-West with a \$23.16 million investment thanks to Royalties for Regions.

A new Pilatus PC 12 aircraft fitted with the latest in medical, communications and aviation technology will ensure remote communities in Regional WA have access to adequate medical response services in a time of need.

The RFDS provides a crucial lifeline to remote communities and the many visitors that frequent our popular tourist destinations and it is great to see *Royalties for Regions* playing a vital role in improving health outcomes for patients.

"This significant essential life-saving service will improve access to quality medical facilities and specialists," said Vince.

"Royalties for Regions continues to support the livability and sustainability of local communities and this investment will bring a timely, safe and appropriate level of service to all residents and visitors in Regional WA."



The \$23.16 million investment will help finance the purchase of two new and two replacement aircraft and has funded the new Broome RFDS base.

Each year, more than 9,000 people benefit from Royal Flying Doctor Service emergency aero medical retrievals and inter-hospital transfers.

"This is another significant Royalties for Regions investment providing essential quality health care services to regional and remote communities," added Vince.



Dog Registration

All dogs over 3 months of age and cats over 6 months must be registered and wear a registration tag and a disc showing the owner's name and address.

ALL dogs & Cats must be Microchipped.

Registrations are due on November 1, and can be obtained for a period of one or three years. Proof of sterilisation is required at the time of registration.

Applicants must be over 18 years of age. Reduced rates (50%) are available for Pensioner Concession Card holders.

If your cat or dog wanders from home, it may be picked up by the Shire Ranger and taken to the pound.

Fees are imposed on all impounded animals and are payable to the Shire Council before the release of the animal.
