

Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer:

- at any time during the above period by arrangement; or
- between 2.00pm and 4.00pm Tuesday, 10 February 2026 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Yalgoo, 37 Gibbons Street, YALGOO.

### Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- The Commission's preferred method for candidates to nominate is through the Commissions Nomination Builder. This tool assists candidates in completing their nomination form, including their profile and additional information. The Nomination Builder can be accessed via [www.lgportal.waec.wa.gov.au/noms](http://www.lgportal.waec.wa.gov.au/noms). Candidates can complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form with the allocated nomination ID, and lodge it with the Returning Officer. Alternatively, a copy of the prescribed nomination form is available from the Returning Officer or via [www.elections.wa.gov.au/Candidate-Information](http://www.elections.wa.gov.au/Candidate-Information)
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 1,000 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$100 (cash, EFT, bank cheque or postal order);
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional);
- every candidate must complete the online course titled *Local Government Candidate Induction*, available at [Induction for Prospective candidates | LGIRS candidates](http://Induction for Prospective candidates | LGIRS candidates), prior to nominating and provide the course code on the nomination form; and
- in addition to the candidates A4 profile, Candidate can provide additional information that they consider to be relevant to their candidature. This written statement cannot be more than 2,000 characters (including spaces), must be in the English language and is for publication on the local government's official website only. (optional)

### Please Note:

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate. The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

# PROJECTS UPDATE

We are pleased to provide the community with an update on current and upcoming works across our roads and town facilities.

## Road Works Update

### **Morowa Road:**

- Grid installation works are underway.

### **Ninghan Road:**

- Culvert works continuing
- Profiling and resealing scheduled to improve road safety and longevity.

### **North Road:**

- A major revamp is planned, including:
- 15 kilometres of road reshaping
- Flood mitigation works
- Installation of two new culverts.

## Town Projects Update

- Mulching of the main street as part of a broader town facelift.
- Re-keying of shire assets underway.
- CCTV system expected to be back online in late February.
- Stone mason works continuing.
- Community Hall works progressing, with completion expected within **6–10 weeks**.
- Ongoing works at the Railway Building.


- When Travelling through the Yalgoo region, be mindful of our roadworks

## RESTRICTED BURNING PERIODS

- **Restricted Burning Period**

**1ST OCTOBER TO 14TH NOVEMBER AND 31ST MARCH TO 30TH APRIL**

A permit from your local Fire Control Officer is required for any burning with the exception of one meter pile burns, which must comply with the rules

- **Prohibited Burning Period, 15TH NOVEMBER TO 31 MARCH**

**It is illegal to burn unless specifically permitted under the Act.**

- **Unrestricted Burning Period - 1 APRIL TO 30 SEPTEMBER**

**Burning at any time of the day is allowed without a permit. Please follow local safety guidelines**

- **TOTAL FIRE BAN - WILL BE ADVERTISED ON THE DAY ITS IN PLACE**

**It is illegal to light an open-air fire or conduct any activity that could start a fire.**

The WA Safety Camera Strategy sets the direction for detecting, deterring and enforcing driving offences for the next decade. It provides the framework to ensure the right technology is targeting the right offences at the right locations... An important feature of the Strategy is flexibility.

The world will keep on changing, which is why this WA Safety Camera Strategy is designed to provide a principles-based framework for automating, communicating and exploring different approaches to achieve the best safety outcomes and help save as many lives as possible.

The Road Safety Commission has partnered with Regional Alliance West, to raise awareness about safety cameras in the Midwest, Murchison and Gascoyne regions.

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## THE HESTER COETSEE LAW WEEK ART COMPETITION 2026

### ENTRY FORM and GUIDELINES

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

LAW WEEK runs from 16 to 22 May 2026.

It is a major community event held each year for the Western Australian community and the legal profession.

This is a chance to find out more about the law and our legal system and provides a unique opportunity to take the law outside of offices and courtrooms into the public.

Law Week is an occasion to help people see how the law affects them on a daily basis.

#### THE THEME

Regional Alliance West ("RAW") is marking Law Week 2026 with an art competition with the theme "Law and the World Wide Web".

Technology is everywhere, and it is not going away. Every day, more of our lives are being moved on-line and we can't escape the rise of AI. The internet has a lot of benefits for us with ready access to information and services and being able to connect with others remotely. Social media has become a major part of how young people communicate, learn, and express themselves. But with that comes risks: cyberbullying, exposure to inappropriate content, and online predators, to name a few.

We don't think about the everyday activity of using our phones, laptops or tablets as having something to do with the law but there are an ever-increasing number of laws that aim to keep us safe online.

The recent Social Media Minimum Age Law means that you must be 16 years or older to have a social media account.

There are laws that make image-based abuse a crime and that deal with issues such as identity theft, the use of facial recognition technology, cyber-bullying and stalking.

We have seen some recent high profile hacking situations with customer details stolen from large companies like Qantas, Optus and Medibank and many dollars lost to on-line scams.

Cybercrime is one of the fastest growing crime types in Australia and people can feel very nervous about the potential for their private and often sensitive information to become public through data breaches.

How have some of these laws affected you? Have you been kept safe online through some of these laws or have they caused you inconvenience?

# GOOD NEWS COMMUNITY STORIES

## **Yamatji Ranger Supports Sea Lion Monitoring on Sea Country**

A Yamatji Ranger has recently taken part in an important Sea Lion monitoring operation at Beagle Islands, contributing to conservation efforts along the coastline. The **Beagle Islands** are a small group of islands in WA found approximately 15 kilometres northwest of Leeman.



**Andrew Ronan**, a Yamatji Ranger with the **Yamatji Southern Regional Corporation (YSRC)**, worked alongside staff from the **Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA)** as part of ongoing monitoring of Australian Sea Lions.

The fieldwork began early at Gum Tree Bay, where the team undertook vessel safety checks before travelling offshore. Activities included maintaining remote camera stations, conducting drone transects, and completing on-ground surveys across several small islands. Rangers and DBCA staff walked both bushland and beach areas to identify and record Sea Lion presence. The team completed their work safely and returned to the mainland before midday.


YSRC says the activity highlights the growing role of Yamatji Rangers in environmental monitoring and marine conservation, as well as the value of collaboration between Traditional Owners and government agencies. Ranger programs such as this combine cultural knowledge with technical training to support the protection of culturally and environmentally significant areas.



### **Fresh warning about repeat offender tradesperson (Trevor James Potter / Ritefix Property Services)**

- Warnbro tradie subject of third warning from Consumer Protection
- 15 complaints against Trevor James Potter since November 2024
- Allegedly owes more than \$20,000 for undelivered work including paving, guttering and fencing

Consumer Protection is again urging WA homeowners to be cautious when dealing with a tradesperson who has been the subject of multiple complaints and is alleged to have taken deposits without delivering the work or issuing refunds.

Since November 2024, **Trevor James Potter** of Warnbro, trading as **Ritefix Property Services**, has been the focus of 15 consumer complaints alleging he accepted payment for various property services, including fencing, paving, pergola repairs and guttering that were never delivered. In several cases, partial refunds were issued, and in another, some guttering materials were supplied, but none of the work was completed and most of the money remains outstanding.

A person who breaches the Australian Consumer Law by wrongly accepting payment and failing to supply the services in a reasonable time can face a maximum civil penalty of \$2,500,000 per contravention.

Mr Potter, who also goes by his middle name 'James', has previously operated under the business names **Teejays Property Works**, **Bluesky Worx**, **Liven your Landscape** and **Trevor's Landscape Services**.

This marks the third time Consumer Protection, a division of the Department of Local Government, Industry Regulation and Safety (LGIRS), has named Mr Potter, following similar warnings issued in 2018 and [2020](#).

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake said the recent complaints highlight the need for consumers to take care when choosing tradespeople.





“Given the number of complaints received and the amounts allegedly outstanding, we encourage consumers to exercise caution and make thorough checks before engaging Mr Potter or any tradesperson,” Ms Blake said.

“Word of mouth remains one of the most reliable ways to find trustworthy tradies – ask neighbours, friends and family for recommendations.”

Consumers are further advised to avoid paying large upfront deposits when hiring tradespeople. For bigger projects, progress payments can be made as work is completed and materials are supplied.





### What is Elder Rights WA?

Elder Rights WA (ERWA) is a holistic legal service for seniors and the aged based in the Civil Law Division of Legal Aid WA.

Our legal team provides legal advice, assistance and representation on certain types of legal matters and our social work team provides a range of tailored social work support in assisting clients in dealing with social, physical and mental challenges.

### Who can use our service?

Our clients are people who are 65 years and older and First Nations and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse clients who are 55 years and older.

We can also provide information and referrals to "third parties" such as adult children or carers of the older person. However, we will not provide advice to third parties in most cases.

### Who provides the Elder Rights WA service?

Lawyers and social workers with specialist experience in laws and issues that affect older Western Australians.

### Our Cost

Elder Rights WA provides free legal advice.

This fact sheet contains information only. It is not legal advice. If you have a legal problem, you should speak to a lawyer. Legal Aid WA aims to provide accurate information but does not accept responsibility if it is not.

## What types of legal matters does Elder Rights WA cover?

### Legal advice and information on matters relating to planning for the future, including:

- Enduring Powers of Attorney
- Enduring Powers of Guardianship
- Advance Health Directives
- Wills

**Note:** While our service does not prepare or write these documents, the advice provided at our service is very valuable in helping our clients to make appropriate decisions.

### Other matters we can give advice about include:

- Loans given to adult children or others
- Money or debts owed by clients
- "Granny flat" arrangements or other shared living arrangements
- Problems arising from living arrangements, including when adult children move in and refuse to leave
- Guarantors for loans/ mortgages for adult children
- Violence, including physical, psychological, emotional and sexual abuse
- Guardianship and Administration matters at the State Administrative Tribunal
- Voluntary Assisted Dying laws

### Other services include:

- Representation in certain Guardianship and Administration matters in the State Administrative Tribunal
- Information and community legal education

## What is emotional or psychological abuse?

Emotional or psychological abuse is when someone calls you names, swears or shouts at you, intimidates or humiliates you.

It includes threats to harm you or your pets.

## What is social isolation?

Social isolation is when someone refuses to let you go out and do things.

It includes stopping you from having contact with your friends, grandchildren, family members, support services, culture, and religion.

## What is neglect?

Neglect is when someone is meant to take care of you but doesn't give you proper food, clothing, healthcare, personal care or shelter.

Neglect can be intentional or unintentional.

Legal Aid WA has a specialist service for older Western Australians experiencing elder abuse.



## How can Legal Aid WA help?

It can be difficult to talk about these things if they are happening to you.

However, there are many services that can support and help you.

Legal Aid WA has a specialist service for older Western Australians experiencing elder abuse, called Elder Rights WA.

Elder Rights WA operates from the Perth office at Legal Aid WA.

Advice can be provided by phone, face to face and through community outreach.

Lawyers with specialist experience in the laws that affect older Western Australians provide the Elder Rights WA service.

There is no cost in receiving advice from a lawyer at Elder Rights WA.
